Planes of Fame Looks at Eyes in the Sky

erial Observation and Forward Air Control Missions will be the subject of the Living History Flying Event hosted by Planes of Fame Air Museum at the Chino Airport on Saturday, Nov. 5. The event will begin at 10am with a seminar describing the very first military mission of manned aircraft and conclude with a flight demonstration by a Planes of Fame Air Museum warbird.

Decades before the Wright Brothers made the first manned, powered flight, aerial observation was a primary mission of aircraft in the form of manned balloons. As far back as the 18th Century, and during the 19th Century as well, especially in the American Civil War, observation balloons were used to effectively track the movements of enemy forces and direct artillery fire. That mission was subsequently passed on to manned aircraft during World War I.

At each monthly Living History Flying Event, members in attendance can have their names entered into a drawing for a free membersupported warbird orientation flight.

Open to the public from 10am until 5pm Sunday through Friday, and from 9am until 5pm on Saturday, Planes of Fame Air Museum is only closed on Christmas and Thanksgiving. General admission is \$11, youngsters 5-11 are admitted for \$4, and admission is free for accompanied children under five. Big Horse Corn Maze & Harvest Festival

CORONA

The end of summer traditionally brings harvest time at many of the local farmers that once were a staple of the Inland Empire. With the change of seasons comes the annual opening of the Big Horse Corn Maze, Pumpkin Patch, and Harvest Festival at the Big Horse Feed & Mercantile in southern Temecula.

Big Horse features 12 acres of corn maze in the design of "California Farmers Feeding the World." This, the 11th authentic corn maze on the property, is traditionally focused on either patriotic or agricultural themes as many mazes are through the county. As the largest one in Southern California, visitors are drawn from as far away as Santa Barbara, Victorville and the Desert communities to pay for the chance to get lost for an hour or two in 6-8' corn stalks.

Pumpkin bowling, corn cannon, pig races, and ducky races round out the entrainment that can take an afternoon to get through.

One aspect of the recent harvest festivals that is unique to Big Horse is the planning and

grooming of a full-sized baseball diamond in the corn field, ala the movie by Kevin Costner in 1989, *Field of Dreams*. A good swat of the bat can drive a baseball into the corn stalks just as Joe Johnson and Ty Cobb portrayed in the movie.

Special to this year is the addition of unique craft exhibitions on the weekends of rare talents such as gold panning, sheep shearing, blacksmithing, and even an old-fashioned pie eating contest.

The Big Horse Corn Maze is open Oct. 8 through Halloween the 31st. Hours are Sat/Sun: 10am – 4pm, and Weekdays 1pm – 5pm. More







Much of Dickens original narrative is retained in this version, and is brought to life on stage by a cast of over 60 actors of all ages. Another CATS innovation for this stage production is the involvement of the Clock Sprites, a group of mischievous sprites who live in The Clock and help the spirits redeem Mr. Scrooge.

S infonia Mexicana's *Dia de Muertos Gala Concert* celebrates Mexico's most colorful and magical holiday by honoring the legacies of Mexico's most beloved artists—the singers and composers who forged the modern mariachi tradition—and celebrating the lives of our loved ones who are no longer with us. This is a family celebration, with gleeful, dancing skeletons and spooky songs for the kids, but also world-class performance by a mariachi like no other with 23 musicians, and featuring the best and most versatile singers in the world.

Hear the music of Javier Solis, Jose Alfredo Jimenez, Lola Beltran, Lucha Reyes, Agustín Lara, María Grever, Pedro Infante, Jorge Negrete, and others.

El día de los muertos is one of the biggest holidays in Mexico and celebrations are becoming more common in areas of the United States, with a large Hispanic population. Its origins are distinctly Mexican. During the time of the Aztecs, a month long summer celebration was overseen by the goddess Mictecacihuatl, the Lady of the Dead. After the Aztecs were conquered by Spain and Catholicism became the dominant religion, the customs became intertwined with the Christian commemoration of All Saints' Day on November 1.

Specifics of the celebration vary with region, but one of the most common customs is the making of elaborate altars to welcome departed spirits home. Vigils are held and families often go to cemeteries to fix up the graves of their departed relatives. Festivities frequently include traditional foods such as pan de muerto (bread of the dead), which can

conceal a miniature skeleton. Plans for the day are made throughout the year, including gathering the goods to be offered to the dead. During the two-day period, families usually clean and decorate graves. Most visit the cemeteries where their loved ones are buried and decorate their graves with ofrendas (offerings), which often include orange marigolds called "cempasúchitl." In modern Mexico, this name is sometimes replaced with the term "Flor de Muerto" ("Flower of the Dead"). These flowers are thought to attract souls of the dead to the offerings. Toys are brought for dead children (los angelitos, or "the little angels"), and bottles of tequila, mezcal or pulque or jars of atole for adults. Families will also offer trinkets or the deceased's favorite candies on the grave. Offendas are also put in homes, usually with foods, sugar skulls and beverages such as atole. The offendas are left out in the homes as a welcoming gesture for the deceased.

Some people believe the spirits of the dead eat the "spiritual essence" of the ofrendas food, so even though the celebrators eat the food after the festivities, they believe it lacks nutritional value. Pillows and blankets are left out so that the deceased can rest after their long journey. In some parts of Mexico, such as the towns of Mixquic, Pátzcuaro and Janitzio, people spend all night beside the graves of their relatives. Some families build altars or small shrines in their homes, these usually have the Christian cross, statues or pictures of the Blessed Virgin Mary, pictures of deceased relatives and other persons, scores of candles and an ofrenda. Traditionally, families spend some time around the altar, praying and telling anecdotes about the deceased. In some locations, celebrants wear shells on their clothing, so that when they dance, the noise will wake up the dead; some will also dress up as the deceased.




