# Soul Band Offers Free Music Workshop For Kids

Local grammy-winning musician partners with Fox Riverside Theater Foundation to offer a FREE workshop for local students

rammy Award winner Gabriel Roth was raised in Riverside, and has returned to his hometown, after nearly two decades in New York, to raise his family. Roth is concerned about the financial limitations of arts education in the schools and wants to encourage others in the music and recording industries to join him in

offering educational enrichment to students of all ages.

He and his fellow band members, Sharon Jones & the Dap-Kings, will perform at the Riverside Municipal Auditorium (RMA) on November 6 and will present a 90-minute music workshop at 3:30pm that afternoon, prior to the show. The workshop is free, and the tour is also offering 300 tickets to the evening show at a greatly-reduced rate of \$15, an offer that is limited to workshop participants and their parents.

Roth is aware that some kids won't know the band, so he is happy to talk about other musicians with whom the band has worked and even -- with some reluctance and humility -- his Grammy awards.

"Some kids may not know us yet," said Roth, "but they know names like Jay-Z and Amy Winehouse, and they know what a Grammy statuette looks like."

The Fox Riverside Theater Foundation has accepted the role of outreach coordinator for the event, and aims to bring in kids, 2nd-12th grade, from all over the region. The Foundation works with a network of schools and non-profit organizations to distribute outreach tickets through its Students at Broadway program, which provides tickets for youth to attend shows during the Fox Performing Arts Center's Broadway season. The Foundation staff and board members are excited to partner with the band.

"This program is an example of our outreach mission," said Executive Director Cynthia Wright. "For some of these students, it is the first opportunity to get up close and personal with specific musical instruments; for others, it is an opportunity to add fuel to the fire of their passion for music and to hear advice from successful professionals."

Hyneman graduated from Indiana University with a degree in Russian. He has received an honorary engineering degree from the University of Maine as well as an honorary doctorate of engineering from Villanova University, with whom he has an ongoing collaborative relationship to help develop new safety concepts for the military. He is the holder of several patents and the winner of numerous industry awards.

Adam Savage received a call from Jamie Hyneman in 2002 to participate in a demo for a TV show, which turned into the wildly popular Discovery Channel & SBS series *MythBusters*. Savage immersed himself in the NYC arts scene before moving to San Francisco in 1990 to parlay his skills into the thriving theater scene. There he worked for dozens of companies as set

designer, prop master, art director and producer before falling into the machine art community where he learned welding, pneumatics, hydraulics, electronics, and robot-building.

After exhibiting his work in over 50 art shows nationwide, Savage caught the eye of the special effects industry and began working as a prop builder and art director for major commercials for Sega, Coca-Cola, Nike, Burger King and Chevrolet. His work on a Coca-Cola commercial earned him a Clio Award nomination.

After a 18-month stint as head of research & development for startup toy company ZOOB, Savage joined George Lucas' Industrial Light and Magic.







The CATS adaptation also features a real-life encounter of Dickens and a young Mark Twain in 1868 at Steinway Hall in New York.

Because of Dickens' on-stage narration, much of his original book-narrative is retained in this version, and is brought to life on the PAC revolving stage by a cast of over 60 actors of all ages. It promises to be a special delight to tried-and-true Dickens fans.

Another CATS innovation for this stage production is the involvement of the Clock Sprites, a group of mischievous sprites who live in The Clock and help the spirits redeem Mr. Scrooge.




