Gerald Dickens Returns to Perform His One-Man Shows

Riverside is an early stop for Gerald Charles Dickens on his 2017 U.S. tour. A great-great-grandson of the literary master, Charles Dickens, Mr. Dickens will perform for the public and for local high school students on November 13 and November 14.

Inspired by the life and works of his great-great-grandfather, Gerald Dickens began performing his one-man shows with a theatrical performance of *A Christmas Carol* in 1993. Since then he has written and performed *Mr. Dickens is Coming!*, *Nicholas Nickleby*, *Sketches by Boz*, *Sikes and Nancy*, *Top Hole!* and *Doctor Marigold*. In 1865 Dickens wrote *Doctor Marigold's Prescriptions*, a short story, which turned out to be one of his most popular Christmas time readings. The Doctor is a market Cheap Jack (itinerant hawker of cheap goods), named in honor of a doctor who assisted at his birth. On the surface he is a trader with a rapid sales-patter, but underneath there lies a story both moving and heartbreaking. Gerald's performance of *Doctor Marigold* is a first for Riverside's audience.

Badge-carrying personnel get two-for-one lift tickets Wednesdays (non-holiday) while enjoying inner tubing in the Southland at Big Bear Snow Play.

Active law enforcement, fire, and military personnel buy one lift pass and get another free every Wednesday at Big Bear Snow Play. Just show proper ID each Wednesday and get a free lift ticket with the purchase of a pass. It's a \$35 value.

"It's our way of giving back to those who serve," said Scott Voigt of Big Bear Snow Play. Badge Days are available year-round when Big Bear Speedway opens in April (weather permitting) for timed kart racing on a Grand Prix-style track.

Big Bear Snow Play, once a ski area known as Rebel Ridge, offers worldclass inner tubing on the longest runs in Southern California. As the guns continue to blast jet streams of snow, Big Bear Snow Play builds special features like whoop-di-dooos and berms in addition to its traditional downhill runs.

For after dark thrills Big Bear Snow Play last season debuted Glow Tubing night sessions, as the runs are illuminated by changing strobe lights that turn red, blue, yellow, and even black lights. Night Glow Tubing is available on Fridays, Saturdays, and holiday periods from 5-9pm.

Getting to the top of all the snow is easy thanks to Magic Carpet uphill lifts that families merely step on and off of. No uphill climb to tire parents and kids out means they save all their energy for downhill fun and get in all the runs they want.

Snow gets groomed nightly at Big Bear Snow Play to ensure the best possible conditions for guests, who enjoy evenly-spread corduroy for their downhill adventures. When it's time for a winter warm-up, head inside the heated base lodge for family-priced snack bar and video games and there's plenty of paved parking.

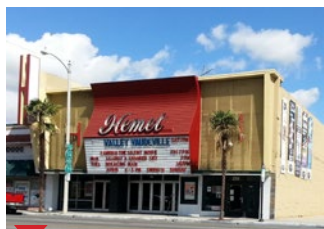

Prominent Photographer Chronicles Blue Cut Fire

Museum opens exhibit of poignant images of the devastation and renewal - "Impressions of Blue Cut, Ruins / Renewal," a photographic essay by Benoit Malphettes, is open at the San Bernardino County Museum. The exhibit will continue through Feb. 25.

In August of 2016, the Blue Cut Fire tore its way through the Cajon Pass. Over the course of eight days, it burned over 37,000 acres and destroyed hundreds of homes and buildings in its path. Although the destruction left by the fire created a desolate setting, esteemed photographer Benoit Malphettes and his wife and business partner Katherine became interested in the resulting landscape. The images they captured, while filled with devastation and loss, also revealed nature's ability to re-

new. *Impressions of Blue Cut, Ruins / Renewal* features Malphettes' works focusing on the ruins that the fire left behind and the renewal that followed.

An internationally recognized photographer, Benoit Malphettes was born in France and by his early 20s was shooting for French Vogue before moving to the U.S. in 1977. He quickly gained recognition for his work published in French and American Vogue, Harper's Bazaar, W, Glamour, Bride, Essence, and more. It was during that time that



he met Kathy Bishop, the creative director in charge of Robinson's department stores. The two collaborated on award-winning campaigns and Malphettes created commissioned portraits with large format cameras.

"In 1992, I was working exclusively on portrait commissions," said Malphettes, "but by 2006 I devoted myself fully to my personal work, allowing me and my now wife, Kathy, to leave the hectic life of Los Angeles and New York for an inspiring new environment and a welcoming community in the Inland Empire." In May, 2016, Malphettes' work was featured in the Riverside Art Museum project, Merchants of Riverside.

Museum Director Melissa Russo added, "The images in *Impressions of Blue Cut* are a moving illustration of the powerful environmental forces that impact human existence daily. The show's conclusion - regeneration in the beautiful wildflowers that emerged from the ashes - are a metaphor for the hope and rebuilding that takes place in

every community after a devastating loss."

The San Bernardino County Museum's exhibits of regional cultural and natural history and the Museum's other exciting events and programs reflect the effort by the Board of Supervisors to achieve the Countywide Vision by celebrating arts, culture, and education in the county, creating quality of life for residents and visitors.

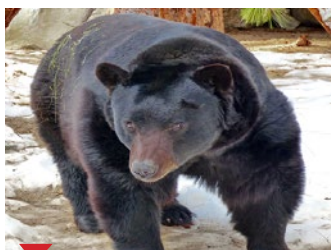

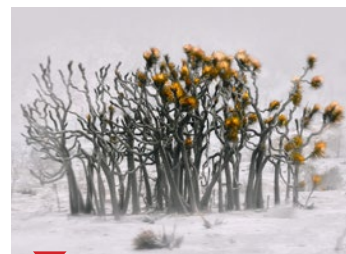

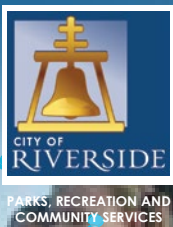
