## **Doolittle Raid Subject Of Seminar**

he first good news for the American public about the war in the Pacific Against Japan, the raid led by Lieutenant Colonel Jimmy Doolittle against the Japanese Home Island of Honshu, will be the subject of the Living History Flying Event hosted by Planes of Fame Air Museum at the Chino Airport on Saturday, March 3. The event will begin at 10am with a seminar about the Doolittle Raid and conclude with a flight demonstration by "Photo

Fanny," the Planes of Fame Air Museum's North American B-25I Mitchell bomber.

Launched from the deck of the aircraft carrier USS Hornet on April 18, 1942, the 16 B-25J Mitchell medium bombers led by Doolittle struck at targets in the cities of Tokyo, Kobe, Yokohama, Nagoya and Yokosuka. Although the actual damage from the raid was minor, the psychological effect was great. It was a great morale booster to the Americans, but a tremendous loss of face for the Japanese who had regarded the Home Islands as invulnerable. As a result, the Japanese made some tactical changes in their operations that eventually proved disastrous.

An independent, non-profit institution dedicated to preserving and inspiring interest in aviation, educating the public and honoring aviation pioneers and veterans, Planes of Fame Air Museum was the first permanent air museum in the American West and a pioneer in the concept of restoring historic display

aircraft to flying condition. Staffed primarily by dedicated volunteers, the museum supports its operations with donations, admission fees, facilities rentals and proceeds from the use of its aircraft and artifacts in various productions.

Planes of Fame Air Museum also has special membership programs available to the public, with one of the privileges of membership being the opportunity to experience orientation flights in genuine warbirds. At each monthly Planes of Fame Living History Flying Event, members in attendance can have their names entered into a drawing for a free member-supported warbird orientation flight.

Open to the public from 10am until 5pm Sunday through Friday, and from 9am until 5pm on Saturday. General admission is \$11, youngsters 5-11 are admitted for \$4, and admission is free for accompanied children under five.


even a selection of Yiddish songs – Jake recreates his unforgettable journey of discovery and lessons learned.

level of sales again, his releases throughout the remainder of the decade – Better Days (2001), And Then... 


