





Dickens Festival Returns To Downtown Riverside

urn back the hands of time in Downtown Riverside with help from the *Riverside Dickens Festival*, Feb. 22-23, at the Main Street Pedestrian Mall near City Hall. This year's festival sees a few changes, including a visit from Jack the Ripper.

In its 21st year, the literary festival emphasizes the 19th century works of authors of England and America, with Charles Dickens as the central figure. Through drama, art, music, dance and cultural events, the festival portrays the life and times of another era. The featured book of the year is Charles Dickens's *The Mystery Of Edwin Drood*.

More than 150 costumed perform-

ers portraying eminent Victorians and characters from Dickens' novels will stroll the street. Musical acts include harmony singers, bawdy belles, and sea shanties. Waltz to live music, with lessons provided. A marketplace with vendors will meet your every need, from costumes, housewares, and sheet music to Victorian scientific equipment. Watch the pageantry of a military parade, see a gatling gun in action, and meet Her Majesty, Queen Victoria. Enjoy a pint at the pub, traditional foods at a dining house, and much more.

The festival runs 10am to 5pm on Feb. 22-23 with the main festival events free of admission. Feb. 21 also features a special Pickwick's Pub Night (\$35 admission). On Feb. 22, take part in Mr. Fezziwig's Ball (\$35 admission for dancers, \$10 admission for observers with children under 12 free) from 8pm to midnight.

History

In 1992, Carolyn Grant, Joan Patton and The Friends of the Library Board of Directors began to explore the creation of a festival for Riverside. A five-person steering committee was formed and the Riverside Dickens Festival was born in September, 1993.

Their objective was to enhance a sense of community among citizens of Riverside County, the Inland Empire, and Southern California by creating a series of literary events that bring people together from all segments of society, and to provide family-oriented entertainment such as drama, musical performances, living history workshops, lectures, classroom study, museum and library exhibits and street fair.

McCormick's has been know for its stable of Corvettes and American muscle cars, plus Ferrari, Porche and Rolls Royce, "an eclectic variety of vehicles both high-end and the very affordable," said Keith McCormick, who has organized the twice-yearly auction for the past 28 years.

"We have had an 82 percent sales rate, which is a record for a reserve auction, not to mention record-breaking sales in dollar figures," McCor-

mick noted.

The best way to view the cars to be auctioned, for sale or on consignment, is to go to the website at www.classic-carauction.com. Available spaces are filling up quickly.

The auction opens on Friday at 1pm and is free and open to the

public. It continues on Saturday and Sunday, with admission at \$15 for one day and \$25 for two days. The tickets include \$10 worth of free cash play complements of the Spa Resort Casino.

The auction will stream live via the Internet for three days and people who register in advance may bid for cars by phone. At the previous auction, people tuned in from across the United States, Europe and New Zealand to bid on cars.

Four cameras will be set up to show different views of each car as it passes through the auction tent. A special bank of phones will be set up to receive telephone bids. To connect to the live broadcast and receive registration information, go to www.classic-caraution.com

People bidding by telephone will have to register in advance and follow the same procedures as people attending the auction, McCormick said. Bidding requires a \$30 registration fee and a "good faith deposit," which is refunded if nothing is purchased.


Riverside Community Players Present 'The Jungle Book'

Redlands' Civil War Era Secret

any in Southern California will be surprised to learn that the only museum, library, and research center dedicated to Abraham Lincoln and the Civil War west of the Mississippi River is right here in Redlands. Part of A.K. Smiley Public Library, the Lincoln Memorial Shrine was made possible by the philanthropy of Robert and Alma Watchorn in 1932.

Robert Watchorn, a poor immigrant from the coal mining region of England, came to the United States with a dream for a better life. His ambition led him beyond the coal mines of Pennsylvania and into government service, eventually rising to an appointment by President Theodore Roosevelt as Commissioner of Immigration at Ellis Island. Following his public service he entered private business, first through a leadership role at the Union Oil Company, and then in his own venture, the Watchorn Oil and Gas Company.

When Watchorn and his wife became winter residents of Redlands in the 1920s, he was already enamored with Abraham Lincoln. He felt strongly that if citizens of other nations understood Lincoln, as he did, it would improve relationships between the United States and other countries. This interest in Lincoln led him to create the

Lincoln Memorial Shrine, a building to house his impressive collection of Lincolniana.

Since that beginning in the stone octagon designed by noted southern California architect Elmer Grey, the Shrine has become a leading institution for the study of Lincoln and the Civil War on the west coast. Thousands of letters and diaries written by those involved in this national crisis have been added to the collections, as well as artwork and artifacts. The centerpiece of the collection is a Carrara marble bust of Lincoln sculpted by George Gray Barnard. In addition to more than thirty documents written or signed by Abraham Lincoln, dozens by members of his cabinet or high-ranking military officials, one of the most important items on exhibit is the painting "Thoughts on Peace on Lincoln's Birthday" by noted artist Norman Rockwell. In 1988, the Shrine was expanded, tripling the amount of exhibit space.

Numerous events are held at the Shrine each year:

- The **41st annual Open House**, Sunday, February 9, from 1-4pm, featuring the unveiling of the new exhibit "1864: This Mighty Scourge of War," will also feature live music, refreshments, and an appearance by President Lincoln himself.
- The **82nd annual Watchorn Lincoln Dinner** will be held on the anniversary

of Lincoln's birth Wednesday, February 12, at University of Redlands. This year's featured speaker is Chairman of the FCC Tom Wheeler, noted author of the book *Mr. Lincoln's T-Mails: the Untold Story of How Abraham Lincoln Used the Telegraph to Win the Civil War.* The event sells out each year; reservations must be made in advance.

AVTT Traveling Vietnam Memorial Wall Returns To The Palm Springs Air Museum For Four Days

rom Wednesday, Feb. 26 through Sunday,
March 2, the American Veterans' Traveling
Tribute and Traveling Vietnam Memorial
Wall will be on display at the Palm Springs Air
Museum located at 745 N. Gene Autry Trail in
Palm Springs.

The AVTT's Traveling Vietnam Memorial Wall is the largest traveling replica of the Vietnam Memorial Wall. It is an 80% replica in size, 360 feet long and 8 feet tall at its apex, with flag display flown over the wall. It contains 100% of the content on the Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington DC with 14 flags flown overhead.

As with last year's visit, the Wall will arrive Wednesday afternoon accompanied by a Veteran motorcycle escort. Planned events include an opening service / ceremony, free evening vigil, and free admission for Vietnam Veterans. 


