





Planes of Fame Features Famous Fighter Plane

he Living History Flying event to be hosted by the Planes of Fame Air Museum at the Chino Airport on Saturday, April 7, will center around a reunion of the World War II United States Army Air Forces 475th Fighter Group. The event will begin at 10am with a seminar by 475th Fighter Group veterans and conclude with a flight demonstration by the Planes of Fame Air Museum's Lockheed P-38J Lightning, the type of fighter plane used so effectively in combat by the 475th Fighter Group.

One of the most successful Army Air Forces fighter groups of all time, the 475th was credited with 552 aerial victories over Japanese warplanes during World War II. Altogether, 38 pilots of the 475th Fighter Group were recognized as "aces" with five or more aerial victories each, including the second-highest scoring American ace of all time, Major Tomas B. McGuire, who was credited with shooting down 38 Japanese aircraft.

Planes of Fame Air Museum has special membership programs available to the public. At each monthly Planes of Fame Living History Flying Event, members in attendance can have their names entered into a drawing for a free member-supported warbird orientation flight.

Planes of Fame Air Museum is open to the public from 9am until 5pm. General Admission is \$11, youngsters 5-l1 are admitted for \$4, and admission is free for accompanied children under five.

Honoring Bobby Unser

he Riverside International Automotive Museum will host its annual Legends of Riverside Racing Film Festival and Gala, March 31, - April 1, honoring racing legend Bobby Unser. Friday evening, March 30, there will be a "Meet and Greet" for all ticket holders.

Bobby Unser compiled one of the most impressive lists of accomplishments in American racing history. He won the Indianapolis 500 three times and the Pikes Peak Hill Climb

13 times in a variety of cars. He was the first driver to average more than 190 miles per hour at the Indy 500. Bobby was USAC Indy Car Champion in 1968, 1974, and the 1975 IROC Champion. His honors include induction into the International Motorsports Hall of Fame in 1990, the National Sprint Car Hall of Fame in 1997 and the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America in 1994.

Along with Bobby Unser, past honorees Dan Gurney, Carroll Shelby and Parnelli Jones have confirmed attending. Max Papis, Hershel Mc-Griff, Jim Adams, Bob Bondurant and up to 50 more veteran drivers will also be in attendance.

The event will include special awards presented to those who contributed so much to our racing heritage, a silent auction of assorted racing memorabilia, an autograph signing by drivers and VIP's (for ticket holders only), continental breakfasts, lunches, cocktail party, dinner, a live auction, and an interview by Ed Justice Jr. with Bobby Unser.



Big Bad Voodoo Daddy on the Fox Stage

ig Bad Voodoo Daddy brings their bold sounds to the Fox Performing Arts Center stage in Riverside on March 24. They appear with special guests Big Papa and the TCB.

Big Bad Voodoo Daddy's eighth studio album, How Big Can You Get? A Tribute to Cab Calloway, captures the essence of an American icon in a rowdy celebration of musicianship, mischief, genius, street smarts, and fun. It's also possibly the timeliest and most welcome album of the year, bringing a much-needed high-voltage jolt of winning, feel-good energy to a country slogging through tough times that may be getting tougher...exactly the way that Calloway's music did in the Depression-era America of his own youth.

Longtime fans of "America's favorite little big band" will immediately recognize the album as a milestone in Big Bad Voodoo Daddy's multi platinum-selling sixteen-year career. "Making the album was one of our biggest musical moments," says lead vocalist, guitarist and songwriter Scotty Morris, who co-founded Big Bad Voodoo Daddy with drummer Kurt Sodergrenin in southern California.

The Fox Performing Arts Center in Riverside announced that Puscifer, with a special guest solo appearance by Carina Round, will perform on Saturday, March 17 at 8pm (doors open at 7pm) at the Fox Performing Arts Center, 3801 Mission Inn Avenue in Riverside.

Puscifer is the experimental Industrial side project of Maynard James Keenan, the mastermind behind such stellar alt-Metal acts as Tool and A Perfect Circle. In 2003, Keenan surfaced under the name "Puscifer" for the song "REV 22:20" on the Underworld film soundtrack.

Keenan was born on April 17, 1964, to a Baptist family and grew up with an older sister in Ravenna, Ohio. He joined the Army in 1982; by that time he had lived in Ohio, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, Oklahoma, Kansas and Texas. Keenan studied at West Point Academy prep school from 1983 to 1984; however, he eventually left the military to study art at




Kendall College of Art and Design in Grand Rapids, Michigan, which eventually landed him a job in Los Angeles. By the late '80s he formed Tool with guitarist Adam Jones and bassist Paul d'Amour.

There are few artists whose names are synonymous with one instrument and how it's played in service to an entire genre than Kenny Wayne Shepherd's.

Utter the phrase "young blues guitarist" within earshot of anyone with even a cursory knowledge of the modern musical vanguard and the first name they are most likely to respond with will be Kenny Wayne Shepherd. Still barely in his 30s, the Louisiana born axeman and songsmith has been selling millions of albums, throwing singles into the Top 10, shining a light on the rich blues of the past and forging ahead with his own modern twist on a classic sound he has embodied since his teens. He met Stevie Ray Vaughan at 7, and shared the stage with New Orleans legend Bryan Lee at 13. As an adult, he continues to create genre-defining blues-infused rock n' roll.

Kenny Wayne Shepherd's *How I Go* not only serves as a strong reminder of the chops that caused *Guitar World* to place him right behind B.B. King and Eric Clapton on their list of blues guitarists, but it's the strongest indication yet of

his gifted songwriting talent. The album pairs Kenny's deeply soulful and impassioned takes on classic material like Bessie Smith's "Backwater Blues," Albert King's "Oh, Pretty Woman" and The Beatles "Yer Blues" alongside the strongest writing and co-writing of his career thus far.

Robert Cray's *This Time* – the first studio album on singer-songwriter-guitarist Cray's own imprint Nozzle Records, distributed by Vanguard Records – arrives at a vital juncture in the musician's career, marked by creative renewal and a key reunion with an old performing partner.

The five-time Grammy Award winner summarized 35 years of mastery on the debut Nozzle release *Live From Across the Pond* (2006), an electrifying two-CD concert set drawn from a series of shows (opening for Eric Clapton) at London's Royal Albert Hall. When the time came to follow up that widely praised collection with a studio recording, Cray viewed it as an

opportunity to move his sound in other directions.

He found exactly what he was looking for by turning to one of his oldest friends and colleagues: bassist Richard Cousins, whose tenure with the Robert Cray Band began with its barnstorming regional origins in Eugene, Oregon, in 1974 and extended through 1991, encompassing such early highwater marks as Strong Persuader (1986) and Don't Be Afraid of the Dark (1988), both winners of the best contemporary blues performance Grammy.

"I've known Richard for 40 years," Cray said. "We go back to 1969, and we grew up in the same area together. We've always

had a really good rapport together stage-wise. Richard and I have remained the best of friends ever since he departed way back in '91. I'd still see Richard, whether it was in the States or in Europe – where he still lives. He'd always come to see us at the gigs. We always remained close. We talked on the telephone all the time.

"It just so happened that last year, I wanted to make personnel changes in the band. So I asked Richard to come back."

Cousins' return to the Cray fold bonds him once again with keyboardist Jim Pugh, a cornerstone of the guitarist's group since 1989.

Don't make the mistake of thinking of Riverside based Rod Piazza as one of the "young turks" of the blues, or part of the "new generation" of blues greats. At this point in his career, Piazza has been recording longer than
