CATS Presents Robin Field In 'Mark Twain And The Shakespeare Mystery'

ho really wrote Shakespeare's plays and poems? That's the mystery! CATS, The Community Arts Theater Society of Big Bear Valley, will present the world premiere production of *Mark Twain And The Shakespeare Mystery*, written by and starring Robin Field, for a limited run at The CATS Warehouse Theater, April 5-14.

Field, who has portrayed Twain on stage before, has adapted Twain's 1909 book *Is Shakespeare Dead?* into an original one-man, one act show asking the question that Twain posed: Who really wrote Shakespeare's plays and poems? Mark Twain was one of the first celebrities to doubt that it was the Stratford actor. Over a hundred years later, evidence is mounting that Twain was right.

Mark Twain And The Shakespeare Mystery opens at the CATS Warehouse Theater, and will play seven performances on April 5, 6, 10, 12, 13 at 7:30pm and on April 7 and 14 at 2:30pm.

Field, who has recorded many of Twain's clas-

sic works as audio books, says: "Playing Twain on stage is a joy, especially when he gets on such an angry, funny rant, as he does in this work. Writing his autobiography near the end of his life, Twain devoted several chapters to this issue. Then he decided to publish them as a separate book. This information has never been presented on stage before. The other 'celebrities' who have shared Twain's doubts include Charles Dickens, Walt Whitman, Ralph Waldo Emerson, Henry James, psychologist Sigmund Freud, actors Charlie Chaplin, Orson Welles, John Gielgud and Derek Jacobi."

But, as Field says, "Twain knew none of this new evidence. So my script presents only what Twain wrote in 1909."

The one-act play, suitable for the whole family, runs about ninety minutes, and is guaranteed to make you laugh and leave you wondering: Was Twain right? You decide.



Fox Performing Arts Center Presents Two Additions To Its Spring Season Of Shows

Quarterflash and Creedence Clearwater Revisited will perform

The Fox Performing Arts Center in Riverside announced two new shows to its exciting Spring season of events ... Creedence Clearwater Revisted on Friday, April 26 at 8pm (doors open at 7pm) and Quarterflash (who will be opening for the Pat Benatar and Neil Giraldo show) on March 7.

CREEDENCE CLEARWATER REVISITED

Stu Cook and Doug "Cosmo" may not have intended it, but their band Creedence Clearwater Revisited has taken on a startling life of its own. The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame rhythm section (bass and drums respectively) from the legendary group Creedence Clearwater Revival launched the Creedence Clearwater Revisited project in 1995 to once again perform live Creedence Clearwater Revival hits touchstones of a generation. Though the pair initially only planned to play private parties, Creedence Clearwater Revisited now performs up to 100 shows a year and released the album *Recollection*.

"We never really had any intention of playing for the public," says Stu. "But a friend wanted to promote a couple of concerts. We got talked into it, but didn't know how it would go over." Since then, the reaction to Creedence Clear-water Revisited's concerts has been astounding, and driven in part by a generation of kids who, as Cosmo says, "Weren't even born when the music came out." Likewise, the release of a doublelive CD on Universal's Hip-O Records label, which features passionate, authoritative versions of 22 classic hits was the result of public demand.

"It was generated by requests of the people who came to the shows," Stu acknowledges. "Over and over they would ask, 'do you guys have a CD?"

Creedence Clearwater Revisited's *Recollection* has proven so popular that in 2008 the RIAA certified it Platinum.

Having now toured North America, South America, Central America, New Zealand, Australia, Europe and Asia, knocking out audiences with astounding concerts jam packed with songs that are still a staple of radio and movie soundtracks, Creedence Clearwater Revisited has come a long way.

As fans who have experienced a Creedence Clearwater Revisited concert can attest, Stu and Cosmo found the right players. Lead singer/rhythm guitar player John Tristao, a powerful tenor with the energy to power songs, initially rose to prominence as lead singer for the band People when their hit "I Love You" bulleted

into the top ten. The newest touring member of Creedence Clearwater Revisited is lead guitarist Kurt Griffey. As a guitarist, song writer, producer and performer, Griffey has recorded and toured with musicians including members of the Eagles, Foreigner, the Moody Blues, Wings, Lynyrd Skynryd, Santana, and Journey. Talented multi instrumentalist Steve Gunner rounds out the group.

QUARTERFLASH

Quarterflash will perform with Pat Benatar and Neil Giraldo on March 8 at the Fox Performing Arts Center. Quarterflash formed in 1980 in Portland, Oregon. They signed to Geffen Records and released their self-titled debut album Quarterflash in 1981. It reached #8 on Billboard's Top LPs & Tapes list, and sold over a million copies, earning RIAA gold certification on February 5, 1982, and platinum status on June 29, 1982. The album contained the new version of "Harden My Heart," which became their biggest single, reaching #3 on the Billboard Hot 100 (and the Top 20 in France). Their follow-up single off the album, "Find Another Fool," reached #16. A one-hour Portland television special, Quarterflash In Concert, was broadcast on KOIN on October 22, 1981, and simulcast on KGON. This concert was taped at the Paramount Theatre on October 15, 1981.

Quarterflash released their second album, *Take Another Picture*, in 1983. It reached #34 in Billboard, and scored the single "Take Me to Heart," which reached #14. The group released their final album, *Back Into Blue*, in 1985.


MainStreet Theatre Company Ends Season With Musical Version Of 'The Phantom Tollbooth'

Legendary Singer, Songwriter Paul Anka Returns To The Stage At Fantasy Springs Resort Casino

aul Anka skyrocketed to fame in the late 1950s and 1960s with hit songs like "Diana," "Lonely Boy," and "Put Your Head on My Shoulder." He went on to write such well-known music as the theme for The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson, one of Tom Jones' biggest hits, "She's a Lady," and the English lyrics for Frank Sinatra's signature song, "My Way." On Saturday, March 16, the legendary performer will take the stage once again at Fantasy Springs and further solidify his status as a music icon.

Anka first achieved success in the 1950s as a teenage singing star who also wrote many of his own songs. Although he appeared in several films, his main interest was music and he concentrated his efforts into composing and making nightclub appearances in Las Vegas. Songwriting and performing "are what gave me the confidence to keep going," he says. Becoming a junior associate of Sinatra and the Rat Pack also had its privileges. By the '70s, the success of "My Way" and a string of hits like "(You're) Having My Baby" confirmed his iconic status. Since the inception of his career, Mr. Anka's songs (BMI Statics) have been performed well over 90 million times.

His later achievements as a recording artist included "Hold Me 'Til the Morning Comes," a hit duet with Peter Cetera in 1983, the Spanish-language album Amigos in 1996,



and Body of Work, a 1998 duets album that featured Frank Sinatra, Celine Dion, Patti La-Belle, Tom Jones and daughter Anthea Anka. If this wasn't enough, it was revealed upon its release in 2009, that Anka co-wrote Michael Jackson's posthumous #1 worldwide hit, "This Is It," which has further cemented his place upon the most prolific and versatile songwriters of any generation. He has written for the motion picture, The Longest Day, for Darrell Zanuck, as well as Buddy Holly, and Barbra

Streisand and recently received the prestigious Johnny Mercer Award at the Songwriters Hall of Fame.

Not one to rest on his laurels, Anka's two most recent albums – Rock Swings and now Classic Songs, My Way - ingeniously featured songs originally created by some of the biggest rock performers of the day – as well as other established artists across several genres.

The twist: Paul Anka did the songs "his way." His goal: "Taking great songs and rework them so they're natural for me." With the help of his five daughters, Anka spent months researching music from the '80s and '90s, trying to find the songs that would work in the radical new context he proposed. The songs that made the cut included Bon Jovi's "It's My Life," Lionel Richie's "Hello" and Eric Clapton's "Tears in Heaven." Even more dramatic were his transformations of "Wonderwall" by Oasis, "Black Hole Sun" by Soundgarden and Nirvana's "Smells Like Teen Spirit."

Rock Swings went Top 10 in the UK, and was certified gold in the UK, France, and Canada, hit No. 2 on Billboard's Top Jazz Albums chart and went on to sell half a million units world-

he Riverside International Automotive Museum will have its annual **Legends of Riverside Racing Film Festival and Gala**, March 23, plus a "Meet and Greet" on Friday evening, March 22 for all ticket holders. The honoree for Legends V is Bob Bondurant.

Bob started in his teen years racing motorcycles and in 1956 he switched to sports car racing with a Corvette and won the West Coast "B" Production Championship winning 18 of 20 races.

During a battle between Cal Club and SCCA, Bob was banned from racing for 6 months. He used this time to learn to fly helicopters and got to be a good pilot. Bondurant then went to work where they rebuilt wrecked helicopters. He never went to school, but learned to follow the cars around the racetrack. He went to the driving school at Sears Point and flew the helicopter every day where he would chase the students around the track.

In 1961 Bob was hired by Santa Barbara Chevrolet dealer Shelly Washburn to drive his #614 1959 Corvette. He drove Washburn's new 1963 Corvette Z06 Stingray in the Times Grand Prix at Riverside Raceway. Bondurant won 30 out of 32 races in Washburn's Corvettes.

In 1963 he became a member of the Carroll Shelby Cobra team, winning his first race. Bob raced Cobras in the states at Colorado's Continental Divide Raceway, Riverside, and Sebring, and then went to Europe racing at the Targa Florio, Spa and Nurburgring. He also raced Le Mans.

Bob served as a technical consultant for the film *Grand Prix* and trained actor James Garner to drive Formula cars. In addition to Garner, Bondurant was a driving instructor to actors Paul Newman, Clint Eastwood, Robert Wagner, Tim Allen, Tom Cruise and Nicolas Cage.

While recuperating from a 1967 Can Am

series race accident, Bob had an idea for a high performance driving school, which opened in early 1968 at Orange County Raceway, then moved to Ontario, Sears Point and in 1989 to Phoenix, Arizona.

Bob is not only the honoree at Legends V in 2013, but his school turns 45-years-old and Bob himself turns 80 years young.

Bob will be joined by close to 50 veteran drivers.

The event will include special awards presented to those who contributed so much to racing heritage, a silent auction of assorted racing memorabilia, an autograph signing by drivers and VIP's (for ticket holders only), cocktail party, dinner, a live auction and interview by Ed Justice Jr. with Bob Bondurant.


