California's Official Outdoor Play, 'Ramona', Is Back

he Ramona Pageant has a history of long term talent with an incredible group of actors and volunteers who return year after year to tell this very important story. Close to 600 cast, volunteers and crew come together each year to take you back to the 1800's providing you a show not in Technicolor, but a live action packed colorful experience you will never forget.

The Ramona Bowl Amphitheatre in Hemet will present the Official State Outdoor play of California April 22, 23, 29, 30 and May 6 and 7. The story by Helen Hunt Jackson is about the trials of the Native Americans as California transitioned from being ruled by Spain to being part of the United States and has been updated for a modern audience but kept the romance and pageantry that made the story so special.

The cast and volunteers bring to life a Spanish Fiesta, an authentic Native American Elder Blessing and cowboys thundering up and down the hills of the beautiful natural amphitheatre. Leading roles are played by Kayla Contreras as Ramona and Joseph Valdez as Alessandro who bring their very passionate and heartfelt roles to life leaving you with a true sense of challenges of the times.

The play has been presented in Hemet since 1923, filled with pageantry and poignancy. The story of "Ramona" is what drove California's tourist industry in the 20's and 30's, people wanting to see where the story full of romance and turmoil took place. Throughout southern California schools, towns and streets are named for characters from Jackson's book. Jackson took the true story of what was happening to the





Native Americans and wove it into a novel that would "move the minds and hearts of America." She did for the Native Americans what Harriet Beecher Stowe did with *Uncle Tom's Cabin*.

A very special part of the Native American Elder Blessing scene is the Hoop Dance performed by Terry Goedel. Terry has been hoop dancing for over 45 years and has been performing in Ramona for 22 years. He has just been recognized as the World Hoop Dancing Champion in the senior division. Terry has three children who are hoop dancers and have performed with him in Ramona. All 11 of his grandchildren are hoop dancers; two have already performed in Ramona. Terry has also passed his talent to his nieces and nephews who have been a part of the play many times. Terry's nephew Eric has performed in Cirque Du Soleil's Totem for the last 5 years and his son Michael will join that performance in Spain this August.

The gates at the bowl open at 1pm on show days and playgoers are encouraged to get there early so they can enjoy all the Bowl has to offer. There is a museum that has memorabilia dating back to the opening of the play in 1923 including a Milford Zornes fresco. The gift shop has a wide variety of merchandise including clothing, jewelry, cups, décor, and of course the novel *Ramona* which has never been out of print.

The food choices are varied and delicious, from hotdogs and sandwiches from the concession stand to dining at the Ramona Terrace with waitress service that features tri tip meals and chicken caesar wraps. Sit back with a glass of wine or beer and enjoy the panoramic views of the valley from the Bowl and experience a performance of Ramona that will provide you a lifetime of memories.



Second Annual Doors Open Riverside Returns

oors Open is an event that provides an opportunity to discover hidden architectural gems and to see behind doors that are rarely open to the public. The first Doors Open Day took place in France in 1984 and the concept has spread to other places in Europe, North America, Australia, and elsewhere. The first Doors Open Riverside was held on May 12, 2016 and attracted over 1,000 people to 15 buildings that were open for interior tours.

The City of Riverside, the Mission Inn Foundation, the Riverside Arts Council, the Old Riverside Foundation, and the Riverside Downtown Partnership will partner on the second annual Doors Open Riverside event, scheduled for Thursday, May 11th from 6pm to 9pm. The event will provide docent-led tours of a number of historic private and public buildings in downtown Riverside. Docents from the Mission Inn Museum will provide information on the history and special features of these building during the tours.

Museums and Churches that will have their 'Doors Open' for the 2017 event include the Mission Inn Museum, The Center for Social Justice and Civil Liberties, the Riverside Art Museum, the Riverside Metropolitan Museum, the First Congregational Church, and Eden Lutheran Church.



California has some of the most diverse wildlife in North America. But you don't have to camp out in the wilderness just to catch a glimpse of some of our state's amazing animals.

he Big Bear Alpine Zoo, founded in 1959, is the only alpine zoo of its kind in the United States. Situated at almost 7,000 feet above sea level, the Big Bear Alpine Zoo serves as a rehabilitation facility for both mountain and nearby communities.

With a nearly 80% success rate, animals are nursed back to health or weaned onto solid foods and then released back into the wild. If an animal is too injured or if it has lost its fear of humans, it cannot be released and has a

home for life at Big Bear Alpine Zoo.

If you are planning a trip to Big Bear, get your wild on! A visit to the zoo is the best way to see representatives of our mountain ecosystem. Located on 2.5 acres, Big Bear Alpine Zoo brings the wild to you, housing over 100 animals, mostly native species.

The zoo is located at 43285 Goldmine Drive in Big Bear Lake, right across the street from Bear Mountain Ski and Board Resort. If you want to know more about

Old Riverside Foundation's 26th Annual Vintage Home Tour Explores Unique Homes

ld Riverside Foundation's 26th Annual Vintage Home Tour, Restoration Faire & Vintage Mercantile will be held Saturday, May 20, from 10am to 4pm. In conjunction with a Riverside Art Museum(RAM) survey exploring Spanish Colonial architecture in the Inland Empire, the theme of this year's vintage home tour is "Henry L.A. Jekel and the Spanish Colonial Revival Craze in Riverside."

According to RAM, the Spanish Colonial Revival style has been part of the aesthetic fabric of Southern California for 100 years. While claiming ties to Colonial Spain and Mexico via their cultural and design traditions, the style was based largely on myth and invention. Influenced by such diverse sources as the 1915 Panama-California Exposition and the popular Ramona novel and pageants, Californian architects and designers adapted Spanish Colonial, Mission, ecclesiastical, and native elements to create romanticized perceptions of California for a burgeoning tourism industry.

"Architects and designers working in Riverside and San Bernardino counties made momentous contributions to the style's proliferation in California, including perhaps one of the most famous examples: Riverside's Mission Inn," said Lindsey Rossi, who's leading the survey for RAM. "With this (survey) grant, we hope to be able to bring more focus to the wonderful historic architecture, design, decorative arts, and material culture that once epitomized the region," Rossi said.

RAM was selected as one of over 40 art organizations across Southern California to share in \$5 million in grants the Getty Foundation awarded to produce new knowledge and insights about a wide range of Latin American and Latino art. RAM's Spanish Colonial Revival survey will be included as part of the Getty's "PacificStandard Time: LA/LA" program throughout Southern California.

ORF is happy to showcase prime examples of this style from the hands of one of Riverside's most renowned architects, Henry L.A. Jekel, as well as welcome RAM on as part sponsor for this year's event.


Still in the planning stages, this year's ORF home tour has thus far secured tours of four Spanish Colonial Revival homes and the exterior of Jekel's own home and workshop located on Magnolia Avenue. Each of the homes is unique, but Jekel's recognizable touches are noticeable throughout.

The tour will also include the Peter J. Weber house – headquarters for Old Riverside Foundation – open for touring. As in the past, Weber's son, Peter N. Weber, will be on hand explaining his days living there, and answering questions.

Outside the Weber House will again be the Restoration Faire & Vintage Mercantile, featuring craftsmen who specialize in vintage-sensitive wrought iron, renovation consultation, tile, plaster work, and roofing. Vendors will welcome back antiques, linens, jewelry, décor, and clay creations for home and yard.

"Planning for the event is still being done, so we anticipate that along with our returning vendors, we'll have a few new ones to pique your interest. Oh, and don't forget the Raffle Baskets – see if tour day is your lucky day!" said ORF Board Member and Home Tour coordinator Nancy Parrish.

Mark your calendars for Saturday, May 20th (the Saturday following Mother's Day) to enjoy a day in beautiful Riverside with a walk through architectural history!

HE COLORS OF MUSIC III, on April 22 at 2pm, will spotlight several of Temecula Valley Symphony's principal musicians in an intimate concert setting at Grace Presbyterian Church, 31143 Nicolas Rd., in Temecula.

Works include The Shepherd on the Rock for Soprano, Clarinet, and Piano by Schubert, featuring clarinetist Chelsea Howell who is also a teaching artist with the LA Philharmonic. She coaches clarinet sectionals and provides students with information about composers and repertoire before they listen to the LA Philharmonic rehearse.

Howard Hanson's Serenade for Flute and Piano features Kate Prestia-Schaub, the Symphony's principal flutist. Kate is an active and enthusiastic performing and recording artist in Southern California. She is the 1st place winner
