

Thousands Gather For The Annual Memorial Day Event

his Memorial Day upwards of 7,000 motorcyclists will pack the street in Riverside in front of Skip Fordyce Harley-Davison at 7688 Indiana Ave. to participate in the annual West Coast Thunder parade. For now, the fourteenth year, the WCT XIV parade will travel first to the Riverside National Cemetery, down Sunnymead Boulevard in Moreno Valley and then on to the Soboba Casino's outdoor arena for a tribute concert in honor of our Veterans.

He will also be available to meet and greet at Soboba Casino's tribute concert following the parade. 




Riverside Community Players Present The Comedic Mystery 'The Psychic'

First 5 San Bernardino Reminds Families to Keep Children Safe from the Start

In California, the Leading Cause of Death among Children under 5 is Drowning

s warmer weather approaches, the dangers of water-related incidents increase, especially for children under the age of 5. In 2012, adults and children in San Bernardino County accounted for a total number of 55 submersion incidents, nine of which were fatal according to statistics from Safe Kids Inland Empire. First 5 San Bernardino's annual water safety campaign addresses this preventable danger to ensure that everyone is aware of key steps to have a safe summer.

Here are the ABC's to a safe summer for the family to enjoy:

A – Active Adult Supervision: Keeping an active, watchful eye can save a life. Most child victims are supervised by one or both parents when water related accidents occur. In 2009, 77% of child victims were missing for five minutes or less when they were found in the pool drowned or submerged. When active adult supervision is provided, the risk can be managed for swimming fun to go smoothly.

B – Barriers: Children can drown without a

sound. Keeping barriers around your pools and other recreational water sources can prevent the silent and sudden moments that can lead to a drowning. Barriers such as fencing, gates, latches, alarms, pool safety nets, and pool safety covers that successfully prevent a child from getting over, under or through the barrier to the pool area are ideal solutions. California requires by law for any new or remodeled pools built after January 1, 2007 to have at least one required safety feature. For details on this law and requirements, visit the California Department of Public Health website at www.cdph.ca.gov.

C – Classes & Preparation: Teach your children how to swim as soon as they show interest. Try taking your kids to classes this summer and join in! Classes are often hosted within municipal parks and recreation departments and community centers. Dial 2-1-1 for resources in your area.

Additionally, taking classes in CPR can prepare you in the event that a submersion incident occurs. Learn proper rescue techniques and keep rescue equipment accessible at the poolside or recreational water area.





Produced by T Bone Burnett, the album finds Allman putting his own stamp on songs by some of the blues giants whose work has long informed his own, from Muddy Waters and BB King to Buddy Guy and Magic Sam. Named for the coastal Georgia region Allman calls home, *Low Country Blues* stands as a high water mark in an already remarkable body of work, rich with passion, verve, and the unerring confidence of a true survivor.

Last year Allman and the rest of the Allman Brothers Band were honored with a special Lifetime Achievement Grammy Award. He also decided to share his struggles and triumphs with others in his memoir, *My Cross to Bear*. "When I got out of high school, I thought, 'I'll take a year or two off and play the clubs, get this out of my system, and then go to med school," he explained in a statement. "More than 40 years later, I figure it's finally time to write about this crazy journey that's taken me around the world and back."

s one of the most popular California pop/rock bands of the '70s, the Doobie Brothers evolved from a mellow, boogie band to a slick, soul-inflected pop band by the end of the decade. 
