

# HONORING VOLUNTEERS AT THE GARDEN GROVE STRAWBERRY FESTIVAL

he 59th Annual Garden Grove Strawberry Festival is a non-profit organization dedicated to raising funds for the community - over \$6.5 million since its inception in 1958. This year fourteen non-profits received a combined total of over \$149,000.

The Festival also benefits many non-profit groups whose food and game booths collectively raise over \$100,000 more. The board awards scholarships to local school students, underwrites parade participation for school bands, and treats over 2,000 special needs kids to a day of free rides and food.

This year's theme is "Honoring Our Community Superhero Volunteers", and many exceptional volunteers and their families will be celebrated in the Saturday parade and treated to a day of food and fun.

The festival - the second largest city festival in the Western United States - will be held Memorial Day Weekend Friday, May 26 through Monday, May 29, at the Village Green between Main Street and Euclid Avenue in downtown Garden Grove.

Last year's attendance was over 300,000.

Highlights include the Friday evening official giant strawberry cake cutting ceremony at 6pm at the Showmobile (Acacia and Main streets) when free cake is served to over 2,000 people. Saturday morning begins with a 5K Strawberry Run followed by an 8:30am VIP celebrity breakfast at the Garden Grove Community Center. Next is a parade at 10am with film and TV celebrities, floats, bands, equestrians and characters.

All four festival days will include 35 carnival rides, 5 contests, over 200 food and sales booths, games, music and live entertainment in the amphitheater and Showmobile. Contests include the Berry, Berry Beautiful Baby Contest, Redhead Roundup, Strawberry Idol Karaoke, and Tiny Tots King and Queen.


Riders control their own speed with the brake, and unlike any amusement park ride, each trip down is a completely unique and interactive experience. Lean into each turn and go into a tuck through straightaways to experience what it's like to be an Olympic bobsledder, or use the brake to go slow and soak in views of the lake and mountains.

For a relaxing change of pace enjoy a round on the Putt 'N Around miniature golf course, laden with rolling greens, water hazards, even penalty-stroke "sand traps."



Plein Air painting is derived from the French "en plein air" which simply means "outdoors." The first painters credited with painting en plein air were the French artists of the Barbizon School impressionist period when painters such as Rousseau (1812-1867) rejected the conventions that stressed studio painting even when painting landscapes. These artists immersed themselves in nature and "chased the light" for a period of two hours or so while painting out-



doors. Generally, one can determine the time of day in a plein air painting by the light and shadows.

In California, plein air painting became popular in the beginning of the 20th century, with a resurgence

of interest starting in 1995 in Laguna Beach, with the founding of the Laguna Plein Air Painters Association (LPAPA.org).
