hile recording "The Boys Are Back" last year, *The Oak Ridge Boys* were presented with the Academy of Country Music's top honor, its Pioneer Award.

From "Elvira," its 1981 Country pop crossover smash, to today's album, the popular quartet brings to the **Huck Finn Jubilee** stage a high energy mix of new and familiar tunes in a Father's Day evening concert at 6pm, June 20

The evening performance highlights the Friday through Sunday escape that celebrates the spirit of Mark Twain at Mojave Narrows Regional Park in Victorville. Each year families pack the camper with kids, banjos and fishing poles and run away for a weekend of fun in the country.

"I've always wanted to see The Oaks at the Jubilee," Don Tucker, who selects performers each year, said. "They join the list of legendary performers like Earl Scruggs, Roy Clark and Merle Haggard who stood center stage at the Jubilee during its 33 year history."

in Country music, *The Oak Ridge Boys* started life as a gospel quartet before modernizing their style into Country-pop. For more than 35 years the classic Oaks lineup of Richard Sterban, William Lee Golden, Duane Allen and Joe Bonsall has four Grammy awards, 16 #1's and 29 top 10 Country hits. Familiar hits like "Bobbie Sue," plus "Y'all Come Back Saloon" and "American Made" became a part of everyday life.

With "The Boys Are Back," the group proves that it is not only enduring, it is constantly evolving. The latest project is a root –music revelation that explores country, blues and gospel textures. "We're doing a lot of these new songs on stage now," Sterban said. "And it's amazing how well they're going over."

At the Huck Finn Jubilee, *The Oak Ridge Boys* headline an impressive lineup of talent, which features 16 acts including the International Bluegrass Music Association's seven time Female Vocalist of the Year, Rhonda Vincent on Friday, its current Fiddle Player and Instrumental Group of The Year, Michael Cleveland and Flame keeper on Saturday, and America's Cowboy storyteller, Waddle Mitchell on Sunday.

A high desert tradition since 1976, the Huck Finn Jubilee not only features top name entertainment on the main stage, but it also hosts guitar, banjo, band and songwriting workshops in a more intimate setting. Musical jam sessions or "picking" parties also run nearly all night long in special campgrounds on the park.

Mojave Narrows Regional Park in Victorville, where the Jubilee is held, sits on a 500 acre oasis resembling parkland found along the Mississippi River. To reach the park, take the Bear Valley Road exit off I-15, then go east to Ridgecrest Ave. and turn north to the park entrance.

AVIATION HISTORY

Planes of Fame presents the 'Heavy Hitter'

66 The Fleet's Heavy Hitter" featuring the Grumman TBF/ TBM Avenger will be the subject of the monthly Living History Flying Event hosted by Planes of Fame Air Museum at the Chino Airport on Saturday, July 3. The event will begin at 10am with a seminar describing the Grumman TBF/TBM Avenger of World War II fame and conclude with a flight demonstration by the Planes of Fame Air Museum's TBM-3 Avenger.

Designed and flown before the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, the Grumman TBF Avenger torpedo bomber first saw combat in very limited numbers during the Battle of Midway Island on June 4, 1942. Operating without fighter escort from a land base, five of the six Avengers that attacked the Japanese fleet at Midway were lost. Nevertheless, the Avenger did go on to establish a reputation as the most successful carrier-based torpedo bomber of the war.

A modern, well-armed replacement for the ponderous torpedo bombers that previously operated from American aircraft carriers, the Grumman Avenger was manned by a crew of three: pilot, gunner and radio/radar operator. Designed to carry a full-size naval torpedo in an internal bomb bay, the Avenger could also employ bombs, depth charges and rockets against the enemy. A total of 9,836 Avengers were built by Grumman as the TBF and by General Motors as the TBM. Also used by the British Royal Navy during World War II, Avengers saw extensive service with many other countries in the post-war years as well. Ironically, one of the last to use the Avenger was the Japanese Self Defense Force.

An independent, non-profit institution dedicated to the preservation of the artifacts and history of aviation, Planes of Fame Air Museum was the first permanent air museum in the American West and a pioneer in the concept of restoring historic display aircraft to flying condition. Staffed primarily by a core of dedicated volunteers, the museum supports its operations with admission fees, donations, facilities rentals and proceeds from the use of its aircraft in various productions.

Planes of Fame Air Museum is open to the public every day, except Christmas and Thanksgiving, from 9am until 5pm. General admission is \$11, youngsters 5-11 are admitted for \$4 and admission is free for accompanied children under five.

Sleds or Slides, Alpine Slide Has Your Ride

Speeding down the long straightaway, the rider leans in anticipation of the upcoming high-banked turns. The sled is but a blur as it whips through the maze of turns and enters another straightaway.

A scene from this year's Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver? Hardly, though these riders do experience many of the same gravitational forces athletes do. These are the individually-controlled Alpine Slide bobsleds in beautiful Big Bear Lake, which allow riders of all ages to get a feel for Olympic bobsledding.

Way more than an amusement park ride, riders get to control how fast – or slow – they go as they descend two quarter-mile long tracks. These sleds never need snow because they have teflon runners and ball-bearing wheels, and by applying brake or letting the sleds roll, guests make their own adventure. Lean into each turn and tuck through the straightaways for aerodynamics and you'll go fast; use the brake handle and sit upright, and go slow.

No two trips down are ever quite the same, and the Alpine Slide experience is a completely unique one, since there isn't another ride like it in California. From the chairlift ride to the top filled with panoramic views of almost-full Big Bear Lake, to the exhilarating ride down, Alpine Slide bobsleds are an interactive experience. While anyone can ride the sleds, skill does matter – the more you ride, the better you get.

Alpine Slide rides are \$4 each, or \$18 for a five-ride book. The area is open weekends until June 5, then daily through the Labor Day holiday.

Thrills are the name of the game at Alpine Slide, also home to the refreshing double water slide. Two side-by-side flumes filled with cool, cascading water take riders through a maze of twisting turns and straightaways, before dumping them out in the solar heated pool at the bottom.

Water slide rides are inexpensive—a buck each, ten for \$8, or an all-day pass costs just \$12. It's a cool way to beat the heat, and parents who don't want to play don't have to pay to get in. Spread a blanket out on the grass or take a seat on two outdoor decks and read a book while the kids have at it.

All prices remain the same as last year to help families bust the

Alpine Slide at Magic Mountain also features Putt `N Around go-karts and an 18-hole miniature golf course, filled with water hazards, breaking greens and "sand traps." Can Am go-karts sport 9 horsepower Honda motors and a slew of safety features including four-point harness restraints.

'Pageant' brings living pictures to Laguna

n search of inspiration for the 2010 Pageant of the Masters, Laguna's worldfamous celebration of art in tableaux vivants – "living pictures" – Director Diane Challis Davy needed to look no further than the backstage cast patio of the Irvine Bowl. There, every night during the soldout run of this past summer's Pageant, *The Muse*, the assembled volunteers who perform in the cast and help out in virtually every aspect of backstage production, were having a blast. Laughter was abundant, potlucks were frequent and the good will was contagious.

There are many reasons the Pageant's intensely loyal volunteers keep coming back to make the survival and success of this 77-year-old summer institution an annual tradition, but the number one rationale is that it's fun. And if the 2010 production, *Eat, Drink and Be Merry*, has one goal, it's to share that sense of exuberant joy reflected in breathtaking re-creations of inspirational artworks.

The director, now in her 15th year, has been aided in her search for artworks to include in the 2010 Pageant by suggestions from the nearly 80 volunteers on her research committee and by veteran scriptwriter Dan Duling, who observed, "It's a well-documented fact artists have always known how to party. And some of the most glorious art ever created has been devoted to expressing the sheer pleasure of being alive."


When asked about the artists whose works will be included in *Eat, Drink and Be Merry*, Challis Davy first cited a classic Dutch master. "I love Jan Steen's pictures," she said. "He was a very accomplished and prolific painter, especially for a fellow who grew up in and spent most of his life in a bar!"

This summer's Pageant will also travel the world in search of artworks that reflect

our collective capacity for seizing the moment, letting our hair down and raising a heartfelt toast to the good life. Along the way, parallels will be drawn between the elegant fetes of 17th century France and the all-night parties of the Jazz Age. Timeless masterpieces from eras as diverse as classical antiquity, Japan's "floating world" and the Wild West,

will reveal how art has enhanced mankind's capacity for celebration both when times were good and when times were hard,



evidenced in a contrasting meditation on the response of artists to the Great Depression.

When asked about any special surprises she might have in store for 2010, Challis Davy noted she's considering a tribute to Mardi Gras that might even involve a little audience participation. But, it's the participation backstage that really inspires her.

"We love to party. Thanks to the camaraderie of workers and volunteers, every year is a great adventure!"

The Pageant of the Masters will be performed nightly from Wednesday, July 7, through Tuesday, August 31, with the 12th annual Celebrity Gala Benefit Performance to be held on Saturday, August 28. CATS Presents 'The Music Man'

The Community Arts Theater Society, CATS, will present the classic musical, *The Music Man* for an 11 performance run at the Big Bear Lake Performing Arts Center. *The Music Man* stars veteran New York and television actor Robin Field as Prof. Harold Hill, the fast talking salesman of dreams and musical instruments who sweeps River City, Iowa's lovely Marian, the librarian, off her feet.

Amanda Fisch, a veteran of many CATS productions, including *Cinderella* and who played Glinda in *The Wizard of Oz*, plays Marian. The production showcases a large cast of talented Big Bear adult and child performers and will be directed and choreographed by Karen Sargent Rachels.

The star-spangled production features such memorable songs as "76 Trombones," "Til There Was You," "Trouble" and "Lida Rose." *The Music Man* is "feel-good" family entertainment at its best.

As with other CATS productions at the PAC, the show features a massive three-area set, designed by Joanne McMaster, utilizing the Performing Arts Center's revolving stage. The use of the revolving stage makes the CATS production of the classic musical very unique. of old age, this play is theatrical storytelling at its most charming. It takes a funny, insightful and heartwarming look at what is profound in everyday life. 


