

The Gatlin Brothers To Perform Father's Day At Huck Finn's Jubilee

'A Great American Party' at Mojave Narrows Regional Park in Victorville

n recent years, a ground swell of interest from dedicated fans has encouraged Larry Gatlin and the Gatlin Brothers to perform selected dates they now refer to as "The Gatlin Brothers Never Ending Reunion Tour." This year, the famous trio who popularized the hit song "All the Gold in California," can be found performing at Huck Finn's 36th Jubilee on Father's Day, June 17.

The 6 pm concert highlights "A Great American Party" designed to rediscover the Good ol' USA, and it takes place at Mojave Narrows Regional Park in Victorville. Each year, families pack the camper with kids, banjos, and fishing poles and in the spirit of Mark Twain, run away for some old fashioned fun in the country.

Larry, Steve and Rudy Gatlin started singing in their little hometown of Abilene, Texas, and from there went on to make music history. Over the course of a four decade long career that has taken the Gatlin Brothers from dusty Texas stages to White House performances, Broadway and Grammy awards, there has been one unifying element, music.

Nearly 50 years of family harmonies, a Grammy for "Broken Lady" in 1976 and Academy of Country Music Award for "All the Gold in California" in 1979 sent the trio to the top of the country charts. There were more than a dozen top 40 hits including "Denver," "Houston" (Means That I'm One Day Closer To You)," and "Love Is Just A Game."

Throughout the 70's and 80's, the Gatlin Brothers lit up major marques and packed concert halls across America. In concert, their performances became magical events, filled with incredible family harmonies and downright fun for both the trio and their audience. But, in 1992 they fell silent for nearly 20 years.

"I always wanted to showcase the Gatlin Brothers, and when they stopped touring, I

> thought I'd missed my chance," states Don Tucker, who in past years has shared great artists like Merle Haggard, Roger Miller and Earle Scruggs with Jubilee fans.

Today, however, Larry Gatlin notes, "You know what Bob Dylan said,... things they are a changin'." To the delight of Tucker, the Gatlin Brothers chose to perform on Father's Day during the Iubilee.

At this stage, the Gatlins have the best of both worlds, family and friends, plenty of work, as individuals and together.

Named Bluegrass Event of the Year by the International Bluegrass Music Association (IBMA) in 2001, the Huck Finn Jubilee continues to showcase top names in Country and Bluegrass music. This year's impressive lineup includes IBMA's Entertainer of the Year, Steep Canyon Rangers, The Seldom Scene, Ronnie Reno and the Reno Tradition, Chris Jones and the Night Drivers, Grammy Nominee, Lisa Haley, and Dry Branch Fire Squad among others.

A high desert tradition since 1976, The Huck Finn Jubilee not only features top name entertainment on main stage, but, it also hosts guitar, banjo, band and songwriting workshops in a more intimate setting. Musical jam sessions or pickin' parties also run nearly all night long in special campgrounds on the park.

The 800 acre Mojave Narrows Regional Park in Victorville, where the Jubilee is held, sits on an oasis resembling parkland found along the Mississippi River. To reach it, take the Bear Valley Road exit off I-15, then go east to Ridgecrest Ave., and turn north to the park.

Swim Lessons in Lake Elsinore



Bill Engvall Goes Blue Collar at Fox

merican Comedy Award Winner Bill Engvall brings his "blue collar comedy" to the Fox Performing Arts Center in Riverside on June 23. The thing that makes any entertainer successful is the ability to connect with an audience. It's the quality of sharing the humor in every-day situations that has made Bill Engvall one of the top comedians today and among the busiest.

Prior to his big screen debut, Bill was one of the stars of the sketch comedy show, *Blue Collar TV*, on the WB network. The ensemble cast included Jeff Foxworthy and Larry the Cable Guy. *Blue Collar TV* premiered on July 29, 2004, 5.4 million people tuning in to see *Blue Collar TV*, making it the second-most watched show in the time period. He also shot a special for the WB network called *Mobile Home Disasters*, which helped propel the network to one of its best Thursday nights of the season. The show was a blue collar version of *Extreme Home Makeover* and the episode took a deserving family and completely transformed their mobile home.

Bill starred in *Blue Collar Comedy Tour, The Movie*, which premiered on Comedy Central and at that time was the most watched movie in the channel's history. It has sold more than 4 million DVD/VHS units. The sequel *Blue Collar Comedy Tour Rides Again* also premiered on Comedy

Central February 13, 2005 and was the third most watched telecast ever for the network. The sequel was released on DVD December 7, 2004 and has sold more than 3 million units. In March of 2006, the Blue Collar boys reunited to shoot Blue Collar Comedy Tour- One For The Road in Washington, DC at the Warner Theater. The movie premiered on Comedy Central June 4, 2006 and was one of the highest rated shows of the year. The soundtrack was released on June 6, 2006 (Warner Bros./Jack Records) and was nominated for a Grammy Award. I





King to serve as tutor to his many children and wives. Loosely based on real events, *The King and I* tells the tale of East versus West, where Anna and the King grow to understand and eventually respect one another, in a truly unique love story. Along with the dazzling score, the incomparable Jerome Robbins ballet, "The Small House of Uncle Thomas" is one of the all-time favorites of the musical stage. CATS Choreographer-Director Karen Sargent Rachels will re-create the ballet for CATS' full-scale production.

When the musical opened on Broadway in 1951, ultimately playing 1,246 performances, a young singer was hired to understudy Yul Brynner and play the part of The Interpreter. The young man was Leonard Graves, who eventually took over the role of The King on Broadway and became a Big Bear resident in early 1990. Graves played the part of The King for CATS' production of *The King and I* in 1997. Since

then, Producer-Director Karen Sargent Rachels has been reluctant to reprise the show without having a stellar King in mind to play the part.

When the multi-talented Robin Field came on the CATS scene, she planned the revival of the show. Field has been seen on the CATS stage with his one man show, *A Musical Comedy Life*, as well as in various roles including Harold Hill in *The Music Man*, Henry Higgins in *My Fair Lady* and Scrooge in *A Christmas Carol*.

Playing Mrs. Anna is Diana Hintergardt who hails from Apple Valley, with a second home in Big Bear. Diana has been seen in *A Musical Comedy Life* as well as the recent CATS production *Bearly Broadway*.

Also, the production must pay attention to the demands of the Jerome Robbins' ballet, 'The Small House of Uncle Thomas,' which is based on the book, Uncle Tom's Cabin, and is used in the musical as an anti-slavery lesson and plea for tolerance in the Siamese Court. As with other Rodgers and Hammerstein musicals, post Oklahoma!, the production cannot be done properly without the inclusion of the 'Small House' ballet, because the story line is promoted through the ballet itself. For this reason alone, many community theaters simply avoid doing the show. You don't see a lot of revivals of The King and I around!"

Joan Sebastian, Singer, Composer, Actor Comes To Fantasy Springs

Performs June 16

oan Sebastian, a popular three time Grammy Award and five time Latin Grammy Award winning Mexican singer and songwriter, will perform at Fantasy Springs Resort Casino on Saturday June 16. 





women's roles in making and inspiring art, and was selected from a feminine point of view. I thought it would be interesting to craft a 'companion' show, one with a masculine sensibility, focusing on the power, strength and intelligence inherent in masterful works of art."

Challis Davy has also chosen a secondary theme for The Genius, the relationship between art and advances in science and technology. "I'm curious about the materials and techniques used by the old masters," Challis Davy said. "One hundred fifty years ago, artists had to make their own paints! You almost had to be a chemist or alchemist. And I'm fascinated by the huge roles played by developments in optics and photography in painting realistic works."

She was quick to add, "But, you won't have to be a rocket scientist to enjoy The Genius."

Clearly, the 2012 Pageant will be very different from the whimsical escapism of last summer's Only Make Believe. Tributes to the lives and masterpieces of extraordinary artists whose works have withstood the test of time will be in the forefront of the 2012 Pageant, including Michelangelo, Vincent van Gogh and the Dutch Masters, to name a few. Legendary composers will be feted in series of artworks dedicated to the "Maestros of Music," and scientific innovation will be highlighted in "The Stars of Astronomy." And Pageant traditionalists will no doubt welcome the return of the Renaissance master, Leonardo da Vinci,

I get inspiration from my scriptwriter, my staff, my composers, and from the scores of enthusiastic research volunteers who come up with great suggestions!"


