Big Bear Rescue Zoo holds Country Fair in July

Blues for the Zoo Concert in August

full menu of adventure and fun awaits visitors at the Big Bear Rescue Zoo (formerly known as Moonridge Animal Park) in Big Bear Lake – plus, it's cool up there.

On July 7, from 10am to 3pm, it's the Old Time Bear Country Fair, where you'll enjoy country fair activities for the whole family, including face painting, jewelry making, bear toss, and bear-roaring contest. There will also be a pie-eating contest between the three black bears – who eats their pie the fastest.

Then, at Swim Beach, the very popular 2012 Blues for the Zoo Concert will be held on Saturday, Aug. 4, featuring fine food, local artisans and those wonderful cool breezes on the Lake. This event will be held at Swim Beach, 41220 Park Avenue in Big Bear Lake. Doors open at 1pm, with music from 3 to 7pm.

Headlining the afternoon of music is Zydeco "crown prince" C.J. Chenier. According to Downbeat Magazine, "his vocals and accordion drip with top-line Louisiana hot sauce, keeping the good times rolling with energized adaptations of blues and Creole R&B classics." Chenier carries on in the tradition of his father Zydeco great Clifton Chenier, playing accordion-based American blues and danceable two-steps, singing in both French and English.

No blues festival is complete without a guitar hero and Jimmy Thackery fits the bill. The six-string virtuoso is known to unleash an intense volley of rockin' blues guitar, guaranteed to leave crowds emotionally spent. His double-edged guitar dynamics allow him to fire off tracer missiles, bend a note so it will fit under a limbo bar, run off dive bomber riffs and find space within the trembling of one stinging note. Though most associate Thackery with his 15 years as the co-founder of the Nighthawks, he ended his time with them in 1987. Since then, Thackery has been on the road as a solo musician proving each night that he is still a guitar powerhouse in the blues.

Starting out the day's musical gumbo will be acoustic Delta blues interpreter Alvin Youngblood Hart. Influenced by the deep country blues, Hart is known as one of the world's foremost practitioners of that genre. After the release of his 1996 major label debut recording, the all-acoustic *Big Mama's Door* (Okeh/Sony Records), Hart was honored with the Best New Artist award by the Blues Foundation in Memphis. His subsequent CD *Down In the Alley* in 2002 was nominated for a Grammy Award in the Best Traditional Blues category. He was featured in the 2003 Wim Wenders' film *The Soul of A Man*, part of Martin Scorsese's series *The Blues* and in 2007, Hart performed in the Denzel Washington film (produced by Oprah Winfrey) *The Great Debaters*, playing a 1930s juke joint musician and contributing several songs to the soundtrack. Continuing in the path laid down by contemporary acoustic blues practitioners like Taj Mahal, his roots also reach back to the classic stylings of Charley Patton, Leadbelly, and Blind Willie McTell.

Advance tickets are on sale, \$30 advance (advance ticket sales end at 4pm Friday, Aug. 3), \$35 the day of festival. Children under 10 are free.





Meet Mr. Bogart

The son of a moderately wealthy Manhattan surgeon and a famed magazine illustrator, Humphrey Bogart was educated at Trinity School, New York City, and sent to Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts, in preparation for medical studies at Yale. He was expelled from Phillips and joined the U.S. Naval Reserve.

From 1920 to 1922, he managed a stage company. He then began regular stage performances. In 1930, he gained a contract with Fox, his feature film debut in a ten-minute short, Broadway's Like That (1930), co-starring Ruth Etting and Joan Blondell. Fox released him after two years.

After five years of stage and minor film roles, he had his breakthrough role in The Petrified Forest (1936) from Warner Bros. He won the part over Edward G. Robinson only after the star, Leslie Howard, threatened Warner Bros. that he would quit unless Bogart was given the key role of Duke Mantee, which he had played in the Broadway production with Howard. The film was a major success and led to a long-term contract with Warner Bros.

From 1936 to 1940, Bogart appeared in 28 films, usually as a gangster, twice in Westerns and even a horror film. His landmark year was 1941 with roles in classics such as High Sierra (1941)

and as Sam Spade in one of his most fondly remembered films, The Maltese Falcon (1941). These were followed by Casablanca (1942), The Big Sleep (1946), and Key Largo (1948).

Bogart won the best actor Academy Award for The African Queen (1951) and was nominated for Casablanca (1942) and as Captain Queeg in The Caine Mutiny (1954), a film made when he was already seriously ill.







Beat the summer heat on Alpine Slide's refreshing double water slide, two flumes of cool, cascading water that whip riders back and forth before splashing them into the solar-heated pool at the bottom. Each flume is filled with an array of turns and straightaways for an exciting trek that's a great way to cool off on a warm day. Sit up and go slower or lay back and become a human torpedo shooting through the flumes.

Alpine Slide's water slide is as affordable as it is fun. An all-day pass costs \$15, while 10 rides are \$10 and individual trips are only two bucks each. Parents who don't want to play don't have to pay to get in, many choosing to read or relax on the grass or two spacious sundecks while the kids have fun.

Alpine Slide is famous for its Olympic-style bobsleds which are in season all year long. Snow is never needed since the sleds have teflon runners and ball-bearing wheels, and the quartermile long tracks with banked turns and long straightaways are cement.

Riders control their own speed with the brake and each trip down is a completely unique and interactive experience. Lean into each turn and go into a tuck through straightaways to experience what it's like to be an Olympic bobsledder, or use the brake to go slow and soak in views of the lake and mountains.

For a relaxing change of pace enjoy a round on the Putt 'N Around miniature golf course, laden with rolling greens, water hazards, even penalty-stroke "sand traps."

Then for more fast fun, ride the Putt 'N Around Go-Karts, each equipped with 5.5 horsepower Honda motors and an array of safety features including three-point harness restraints, hydraulic disk brakes, rack and pinion steering and padded steering wheels. The tire-lined track sports hair pin and high banked turns as riders circle under the pines at 7,000 foot elevation.

Alpine Slide at Magic Mountain also has an indoor lodge where guests escape the sun with video games and a family-priced snack bar that includes an old-fashioned Breyers ice cream counter. On weekends there's a great outdoor barbecue on the deck.







- Excalibur is the No. 1 purchaser of Cornish Game Hens in the United States. Since June 1990, approximately 6,400,000 hens have been served.
- Tournament of Kings had 48 marriage proposals in 2008. Everyone said, "Yes, I will marry you."
- There are 30 horses (and twelve different breeds) in the Tournament of Kings stable. Twelve horses are used in each performance.
- The soil used in the arena is mixed with synthetic fibers to create a better cushion. This is important because many of the show's stunt falls are done off of the horses.



A Safe Haven For Injured Wildlife

Three bald eagles were stolen from Big Bear's Moonridge Zoo in 1989, and a week later their massacred remains were found near the North Shore of Big Bear Lake. This event triggered the formation of The Friends of the Moonridge Zoo as a nonprofit 501(c)(3) to provide support for the worthwhile mission of the Big Bear Rescue Zoo.


The Big Bear Rescue Zoo, formerly known as the Moonridge Animal Park and located at Big Bear Lake in San Bernardino National Forest, has been rehabilitating injured, orphaned and imprinted wildlife for the past 50 years. Local, county, state and federal entities as well as other nonprofit organizations and the public turn to Big Bear Rescue Zoo as the "go to" facility to help animals in need. These animals receive a temporary safe haven while they heal, or they are provided a permanent "home for life" if they are unable to survive in the wild on their own. The Zoo has a track record of successfully rehabilitating and releasing 90% of the animals brought to them. The animals that remain in the park become ambassadors to educate the public.

Plans are in place to relocate the Big Bear Rescue Zoo, which will house a new state-of-the-art wildlife animal sanctuary and rehabilitation center that will be open to the public. The land for the new, larger facility has already been secured. PGAV, a world renowned architectural firm, has designed the master plan, and San Bernardino County is currently completing the steps for building permits.
