





As a teenager, he recalls, "I would always show up early – sometimes even before they did – and help them unload the bus. It was my dream to sing with them one day."

That opportunity came in the Spring of 1990, when Cathedrals bass singer George Younce heard Ernie sing a solo at Oakland City College in Evansville. Within a week, young Haase was on the way to his first performance as the Cathedrals' new tenor, a post he held until the quartet's final tour ended in 1999.

Haase and others started touring as Signature



Sound in 2002, quickly building a huge following and a reputation for thinking and performing "outside the box." In addition to traditional gospel concerts and recordings that include gold and platinum DVDs, the quartet introduced high-energy harmonies and messages of hope to NASCAR crowds and corporate events, touring from Latvia to India and South Africa to New Zealand.

Quartet personnel in 2015 are tenor and front-man Haase; lead singer Devin McGlamery, bass Paul Harkey, and baritone Doug Anderson, the only continuing original member along with Haase. However, Anderson last April 28 announced plans to leave the group in order to concentrate on his successful solo career. Wayne Haun will play with the quartet on piano and keyboards in the Loma Linda concert.




### IN 2015 PAGEANT OF THE MASTERS, ART TRACKS 'The Pursuit of Happiness'

to have a surprising knack for topical resonance. This summer's Pageant, with its blend of art and

theatre, will offer its own perspectives. "It's going to be fun, entertaining and educational," Challis Davy explained. "Past and present sources of happiness will be considered, and we'll present themes and memes that everyone can relate to."

"The desire for happiness," she continued, "is integral to being human. Today we share the same basic wants and face the same struggles as our distant ancestors. The need to be 'happy' is a trait that unites us across all nationalities, races and religions." Challis Davy added, "We are living a fast-paced existence in the digital age. Maybe this is a good time to slow down and consider the ways in which art reflects the quest for happiness in different eras and different cultures. 
Riverside Community Players completes its 90<sup>th</sup> season with the heavenly inspired musical *Nunsense* written and composed by Dan Goggin.





The Stylistics are one of the best-known Philadelphia soul groups of the 1970's. They formed in 1968, and were composed of lead Russell Thompkins, Jr., Herb Mur-

rell, Airrion Love, James Smith, and James Dunn. All of their U.S. hits were ballads, graced by the soaring falsetto of Thompkins, Jr. and the lush productions of Thom Bell, which helped make the Stylistics one of the most successful soul groups of the first half of the 1970s.

During the early 1970s, the group had 12 consecutive U.S. R&B top 10 hits, including "Stop, Look, Listen," "You Are Everything," "Betcha by Golly, Wow," "People Make the World Go Round," "I'm Stone in Love with You," "Break Up to Make Up," and "You Make Me Feel Brand New." Today's Stylistics are the two originals, Love and Murrell, joined by Harold Eban Brown and Jason Sharp.

The Dramatics originated in Detroit, Mich., and became national stars in 1971 when "What You See Is What You Get" hit the top 10 in the Billboard Hot 100 and then went gold. The group has continued to perform and today its members are L.J. Reynolds, Leon Franklin, Donald Albert, Winzell Kelly and Larry "Squirrel" Demps.

Also Performing live at this event is R&B's Evelyn Champagne King, with her 70's hits "Shame" and "Love Come Down," The Originals with their hits "Baby I'm For Real" and "Hear the Bells," 5 Tempting Men will open the evening with a tribute to Motown, with Hit songs form the Temptations, "My Girl", "Just My Imagination," "Get Ready" to name a few. 




