





Guests get all the wet, wild fun they can handle with new anytime water slide season passes available for just \$69. Hit the twin flumes filled with cool, cascading water and plenty of twists, turns and straightaways anytime you want with Alpine Slide operating daily. The anytime pass pays for itself in less than five visits.

Also available are Sunday through Friday season passes for only \$49 (excluding July 4th). Either way guests get all the play in the spray they want as they whip through refurbished flumes before splashing into the solar heated pool at the bottom...a great way to beat summer heat!

The water slide is always an

affordable way to play anyway with all-day passes just \$15, 10 rides for \$10, or single rides for \$2. Parents who don't play never have to pay, many choosing to sit on one of two spacious sundecks with a good book while the kids have a blast. Or, head to the recently expanded indoor base lodge to escape the sun where there's video games and family-priced snack bar that includes an old-fashioned Breyers ice cream counter.

Alpine Slide is famous for its Olympic-style bobsleds which are in season all year long. Snow is never needed since the sleds have teflon runners and ballbearing wheels, and the quartermile long tracks with banked turns and long straightaways are cement.

Riders control their own speed with the brake, and unlike any amusement park ride, each trip down is a completely unique and interactive experience. Lean into each turn and go into a tuck through straightaways to experience what it's like to be an Olympic bobsledder, or use the brake to go slow and soak in views of the lake and mountains.

For a relaxing change of pace enjoy a round on the Putt 'N Around miniature golf course, laden with rolling greens, water hazards, even penalty-stroke "sand traps."

Then for more fast fun, ride the Putt 'N Around Go-Karts, each equipped with 5.5 horse-power Honda motors and an array of safety features including three-point harness restraints, hydraulic disk brakes, rack and pinion steering and padded steering wheels. The tire-lined track sports hair pin and high banked turns as riders circle under the pines at 7,000 foot elevation.







Gospel Recording Icon Guy Penrod In Loma Linda Concert Aug. 20

opular gospel recording artist Guy Penrod will be featured in a live concert at Loma Linda University Church on August 20. Online and telephone ticket sales have opened for the appearance as part of the award-winning singer's national "Pray About Everything" tour, sponsors of the Loma Linda event announced this week.

Penrod is known to millions for his Grammy and Dove award-winning recordings and his many televised appearances with the Gaither Homecoming Tour and Gaither Vocal Band. His rare concert appearance in the Inland Empire is co-sponsored by the host church and the nearby Calimesa Seventh-day Adventist Church, in collaboration with the Calimesa Community Concert Series.

His first solo DVD, "Live Hymns and Worship," was also released this year and debuted at number one in Billboard's contemporary Christian music chart.

He was named "Soloist of the Year" by the National Quartet Convention in 2013.

Born into a Baptist pastor's family in Taylor, Texas, young Guy showed musical promise at an early age. He recorded his first album as a high school student in New Mexico, singing all four parts.

After graduation from Liberty University, Penrod pursued his musical career as a studio and back-up singer, working with many notable musicians. During this period he first met Christian recording mogul Bill Gaither, and accepted his position with the Gaither Vocal Band in 1994. With the Gaither musical groups he toured extensively in the United States and Canada as well as in Europe, Australia, and Africa.

Today he lives on a farm in Tennessee with his wife Angie, their eight children, and an assortment of cows and farm animals. The children – seven boys and one girl (the youngest) – are all home-schooled.

Big Bear Alpine Zoo Strives Towards New Heights

igh in the mountain region of Big Bear Lake, a gaze of raccoons (that's what you call a group of raccoons) is scurrying across branches foraging for food items while other members of the gaze are busy at a nearby water source involved in their dunking ritual, rinsing their food through the water. What at first appears to be both food and hand washing is actually the technique used by raccoons to heighten their sense of touch, giving them precise information on what they are about to consume.

Not far away, a male black bear tilts his head up and with a rapid succession of airflow through his nostrils, determines that a tasty food source is close by. His sense of smell, 100 times more powerful than that of a human's, picks up a scent of an edible possibility. With massive arm and shoulder strength to accompany the incredible sense of smell, the 400-pound omnivore moves massive logs in an effort to find each morsel of hidden edible treasure.

Known for their expertise as an ambush predator, two mountain lions blend in with their surrounding mountain flora, hiding between bark and branch. Above the ground, the brown, black, and grey hues of their fur makes them almost invisible allowing them to scan the activity on the ground beneath them.

A perfect match for the surrounding bark of forest trees, their stealth-like behavior makes them almost undetectable.

California has some of the most diverse wildlife in North America. But you don't have to camp out in the wilderness just to catch a glimpse of some of our state's amazing animals. In fact, the animals described above are actually animals at the Big Bear Alpine Zoo. Founded in 1959, the Big Bear Alpine Zoo is the only Alpine Zoo of its kind in the United States. Situated at almost 7,000 feet above sea level, the Big Bear Alpine Zoo serves as a rehabilitation facility for both mountain and nearby communities. With a nearly 80% success rate, animals are nursed back to health or weaned onto solid foods and then released back into the wild. If an animal is too injured or if it has lost its fear of humans, it cannot be released and has a home for life at Big Bear Alpine Zoo.

"Our goal at the zoo is to connect our guests to wildlife, to demonstrate both the uniqueness of our animals and their habitat in the wild," says Curator Bob Cisneros. "As for our animals, we focus on their natural behaviors, providing them with opportunities to thrive. I think this combination of connecting guests to wildlife and meeting the welfare needs of our animals makes us very successful at what we do."

If you are planning a trip to Big Bear, get your wild on! A visit to the zoo is the best way to see representatives of our mountain ecosystem. Located on 2.5 acres, Big Bear Alpine Zoo brings the wild to you, housing over 100 animals, mostly native species.

The zoo is open daily from 10am through 5pm and is located at 43285 Goldmine Drive in Big Bear Lake, right across the street from Bear Mountain Ski and Board Resort.

Each day at noon there is an animal presentation done by one of their keepers and three animal enrichment talks at 1pm, 2pm, and 3pm.


