



Riverside Community Players Unveil New Season, Its 88th

elebrating its 88th season of presenting quality live theatre, Riverside Community Players has announced a diverse line-up of shows for 2012-13. Theatre patrons are sure to enjoy yet another scintillating season of theatre-in-the-round as RCP presents comedy, mystery, drama, and a charmingly romantic musical comedy – *Triumph of Love*.

"Each year our goal is to try to include something for everyone to enjoy," RCP Board Member Jennifer Lawson said. "We are bringing back some of our audience's favorite playwrights, but we are also presenting some newer works that will engage, and maybe even challenge, our patrons."

In the interest of exposing local audiences to lesser-known but important works, the Community Players will present two Inland Empire premieres.

To begin the new season with plenty of laughter, RCP will present Ken Ludwig's raucous farce Lend Me a Tenor in September. The world famous tenor, Tito Morelli, has been invited to perform Otello at the Cleveland Opera in celebration of their Tenth Anniversary season. Arriving terribly late and through a hilarious series of mishaps, Morelli is given a double dose of tranquilizers and passes out. Thinking he is dead, the opera manager convinces his assistant Max to take Morelli's

place. In full makeup and costume, Max succeeds in fooling the audience, but Morelli revives, dons a costume and now there are two Otellos in the house! Misunderstandings and mayhem abound in this hilarious comedy by the author of *Leading Ladies* and *Moon over Buffalo*.

In November, the Players will offer A.R. Gurney's 2011 comedy Black Tie. Gurney, a prolific drama-Black Tie tist who has delivered such theatrical gems as Love Letters and *The Dining Room*, may be best known to Riverside audiences as the author of the smash hit Sylvia. In Black Tie, Curtis learns that his son is getting married, and he is thrilled to share the time-honored traditions that have been passed from father to son for generations. Curtis plans a rehearsal dinner and a toast that would make his own father proud. Unfortunately for Curtis, the free-spirited bride and her unconventional family have different ideas of what is expected on such an occasion. Cultures clash in hilarious ways, and Curtis finds himself in a quandary over which traditions to give up and which to defend.

RCP's January 2013 offering is the award-winning drama *Farragut North* by Beau Willimon. The basis for the recent blockbuster film *The Ides of March*, starring

George Clooney, it is a timely story about the

lust for power and the costs one will endure to achieve it. The story centers on Stephen Bellamy, a wunderkind press secretary who has built a career that men twice his age would envy. However, during a tight presidential primary race, Stephen's meteoric rise falls prey to the backroom politics of more seasoned operatives. Willimon, who worked for 2004 Democratic presidential candidate Howard Dean, named the play after the Washington D.C. Metro station used daily by lobbyists and advocacy groups.

Opening in March 2013, RCP audiences will enjoy their favorite playwright as they try to figure out "whodunit" in *Agatha Christie's Go Back for Murder*. Before dying in prison for poisoning her husband, Caroline Crale wrote her daughter, Carla, that she was innocent. Fifteen years after her father's death, Carla and her solicitor, Justin, persuade those present at the time of his death to return to the scene of the crime. Justin goes back through the events of that fatal day to discover the truth and to determine once and for all whether Caroline was innocent or guilty.

Continuing the tradition of introducing their audience to works that are "off the beaten path," in May 2013 RCP will present Sam

iverside Community Players announced that award-winning playwright Ron House will present his new work *Swift Fox: The Untold Story of Willie Boy* as the Players' August Reader's Theatre production. This profound documentary drama, which is based on a true local story, will play for two performances only, Saturday, August 4 at 8pm, and Sunday, August 5 at 2pm, at the intimate theatre-in-the-round.

On September 25, 1909, an incident occurred here in Riverside County with controversial results that gained national attention: Three Dead And One Badly Wounded. However, there was no way to tell exactly what happened, since there were so many versions of the same story. The "myth" of Willie Boy was born.

Ron House is a New York Drama Desk Award-winning playwright and author of such dramas as *Bullshot Crummond* and *El Grande de Coca Cola*. He also has been honored as "Best Director" three years in a row by the Desert Theatre League. For *Swift Fox*, House has worked in collaboration with the Native American community and the authors of earlier works to create what he hopes will be the definitive Willie Boy story for our area and beyond.

"Having Mr. House workshop his play here in our venue, assisted by the marvelous local director Patricia McQuillan, and featuring fantastic local talent is very exciting for the Players," RCP Board Member Jennifer Lawson said. "We had the pleasure of premiering Riverside playwright

Robert Merrill's romantic comedy Aria's last season, which was a great success. We hope to continue to be a venue where playwrights can come to develop their work."

Tickets for the show are only \$5 each for general admission seating, and may be purchased in advance by calling the box office at (951) 686-4030. Because seating is limited, advance purchase is recommended. There is no late seating, and children under five are not admitted.

New Fox Fall Season Announced

New Season Starts With America's Got Talent's Terry Fator

ill Malone, Operator of The Fox Performing Arts Center in Riverside, announced its initial line-up of extraordinary programming for the fall, 2012 season opening with Terry Fator: Ventriloquism in Concert. The "America's Got Talent" winner brings to life a cast of characters with comedy, celebrity singing impressions and unparalleled ventriloquism. Through comedic banter and amazing vocal impressions of musical superstars spanning generations and genres, Terry Fator: Ventriloquism in Concert will perform on Friday, September 14 at 8pm (doors open at 7pm) at the Fox Performing Arts Center, 3801 Mission Inn Avenue in

Best known for his victory on "America's Got Talent," Terry Fator captured the hearts...and funny bones...of America in 2007 with his unique combination of celebrity impressions and unparalleled ventriloquism. Yet his rise from his time with an obscure cover band to his eponymous theatre at The Mirage Hotel & Casino was 32 years in the making.

Riverside.

Fator first discovered his knack for impressions at the age of six, when he began performing Bill Cosby comedy routines for his family and friends. A few years later, Fator found his true passion through the book *Ventriloquism for Fun and Profit* and quickly learned how to throw his voice, resulting in his first paying gig at the age of 12. Only one year later, Fator first meshed ventriloquism, puppetry and celebrity impressions resulting in a lion puppet, fittingly named Jackyl Mikeson, to sing "Rock With You" by the King of Pop, Michael Jackson. As a kid, Fator worked long, hard hours for his family's cleaning business, during which he would practice his impressions.

As a young man, Fator sang lead vocals for *Texas the Band*, a group whose playlist ranged from *Garth Brooks* to *Guns N' Roses*. Honing his skills as an impressionist, Fator would sing each song just like the original artist. From there, Fator branched out to begin his solo career. What started as 30-minute gigs at county fairs led to school performances and eventually well-paying corporate events. A trip to Las Vegas in 2005

stoked Fator's desire to become a big-name entertainer and he left with visions of billboards and bright lights, all donning his name.

In the months leading up to Fator's win on *America's Got Talent*, he suffered two potentially career-ending blows. Looking for luck, Fator returned to Las Vegas to play a convention, at which three top producers saw him perform. Longing for his big break, Fator was met with

disappointment as each producer told him why he wasn't Las Vegas material. Returning to his reality of county fairs and outdoor stages, Fator hit an all-time low when one of his performances was moved to an indoor theater due to rain. Built for 1,000, Fator took to the stage to find only one fan in the audience.

Unwilling to give up, Fator was persuaded to audition for *America's Got Talent* when he saw a ventriloquist from season one on the *The Late Show with David Letterman*. During his audition, Fator stunned the judges with his puppet Emma Taylor and her impression of Etta James. The process of getting from the auditions to the first episode was incredibly challenging for Fator, but he made it and opened with the same showstopper that got him there, Emma Taylor doing "At Last."

Fator never truly believed he could win, rather he just kept hoping to make it through

to one more episode. This mentality continued throughout the entire season, culminating in the final episode. A stunning Roy Orbison performance of "Crying," courtesy of Winston The Impersonating Turtle, led to an eruption of praise from the audience, the judges and America. His life would never be the same.

In one year, Fator went from small-town appearances to *The Today Show, The Oprah Winfrey Show, The Ellen DeGeneres Show* and, at long last, *The Late Show with David Letterman.* Finally in 2008, his biggest dream was realized when he signed a multi-year contract to perform in his very own theater at the legendary Las

Vegas resort, The Mirage.

In December 2008, Fator released Who's the Dummy Now?, a candid autobiography chronicling this story and his "overnight" success. Performing on the Las Vegas Strip has been a dream of Fator's for more than 12 years, a dream he never gave up on.

March 2012 marked Fator's three year anniversary as a successful headliner on the world-famous Las Vegas strip. From the anniversary emerged his newest character, the Vegas-appropriate career lounge singer Monty Carlo. Monty joins a cast that includes Winston The Impersonating Turtle, cowboy Walter T. Airdale, Hyphen, Julius, Emma Taylor, Duggie Scott Walker, Vikki "The Cougar," Wrex the crash test dummy and Berry Fabulous. Each character allows Fa-

tor to sing a different genre in an unbelievable manner with performances ranging from Garth Brooks and Dean Martin to Aretha Franklin, Lady Gaga and more – Fator does it all without moving his lips.

September 20, 7:00 p.m. BLUES TRAVELER

It's not every band that's still staking out new musical territory and embracing fresh challenges more than 20 years into their career, but that's the case with Blues Traveler.

Their body of work encompasses eight studio albums and four live discs, six of them certified Gold or Platinum, with combined worldwide sales of more than ten million units. The band's best-known single, "Run-Around," was the longest-charting radio single in Billboard history. Along the way, the band has







As a result, the Pageant has become more fluid, with seamless transitions often performed in full view of the audience. Other technical advances have provided some of the Pageant's most memorable moments: In the heat of the summer of 2003, it "snowed" in the Irvine Bowl. And in 2011, giant dragons "breathed fire" and held court in the Irvine Bowl.

One other constant has been the unique challenge of live performance in a 2,600-seat outdoor venue. This summer, that venue will showcase subtle but invaluable improvements to both lighting and sound.

With an extensive background in audio, and 21 years with the Pageant, Jon Tschirgi is a master of many domains. Last year, he was listed not only as Sound and Video Engineer, but also credited for his contributions to Video Production and Video Special Effects. When asked about what technical improvement excites him most, there was no contest. "This year, with our brand new L-Acoustics all-digital sound system, the sound is going to be phenomenal," he said with infectious enthusiasm. "I'm confident there will be a clarity and excitement in the sound that we have never come close to. This L-Acoustics system is the same sound system they use at the Hollywood Bowl and the Civic Opera House. And in Orange County, we are the only venue that has this sound system."

Richard Hill has been the Pageant's Technical Director for 22 years. He's still energized by his collaboration with director Diane Challis Davy. This summer, he's especially excited about the

implementation of an LED stage lighting system. "With these new LED lights, you can dim them and they retain the correct color temperature."

Since reliable, high-resolution video projectors became affordable, director Challis Davy has been especially pleased with the opportunity this has created for crafting mini-documentaries that can "tell more of the story."

Here again, advances in computer technology and software have given Tschirgi and Hill the tools to create these visual effects in-house. And with the appearance of the flying saucer hovering over the hillside in 2001's Beyond the Horizon, the use of inflatables also became a popular addition to Pageant special effects. Since then, inflatables like King Kong (2009) and a dragon (2011) have all made memorable Pageant appearances.

Technical Director Hill recalled some of the challenges he faced when he first came to work at the Pageant in the 1980s. "When I got here, we used to hoist the [lighting instrument] pipes up and down with block-and-tackle. There was no counterweight system. There was also no turntable stage (adjoining the stage house to the audience's left), until the late 1980s."

Its impact on the pace and rhythm of the Pageant since then cannot be overstated. Director Challis Davy has been particularly pro-active in creating multiple uses for the turntable stage to dramatic effect. But, in Richard Hill's estimation, even more significant was the completion in 2004 of the new scene shops. These made it possible to create more and larger sets and provide for their storage and easy movement onto the stage.

Director Challis Davy also noted how the search for Pageant artworks used to require hours of searching through the Pageant's limited art library as well as all other local library systems. Today, she marvels at the ability to explore the world's greatest art collections at the click of a mouse. Her longtime scriptwriter Dan Duling concurred.

For all the improvements and innovations, the Pageant is still live theatre with a live narrator and professional 30-piece orchestra, and hundreds of volunteers making up the cast and backstage support teams. Director Challis Davy, for one, wouldn't have it any other way. Throughout, she has maintained a clear vision of what's fundamentally unchanged during its 79 years. "Our very 'hands on' way of building tableaux will never change.

There is no replacement for the time-consuming, trial-and-error work that is done by the team. Set construction, set painting, making costumes, applying makeup...these tasks are exacting and must be done the old fashioned way. It's a proverbial labor of love."

Challis Davy and her team agree that sometimes magical moments where art and life intersect are possible. That's why, nearly 80 years later, the Pageant is still in the business of making "living pictures." Evolutionary, and maybe just a little bit revolutionary.
