COME VISIT THEIR ARCTIC FOX

Aurora came to the Zoo in April of 2012 when she was between one and three years of age. She was on the rooftop of a house in Beverly Hills for three days before Animal Control captured her and sent her to a rehabilitator. Since arctic foxes are considered to be a restricted species by Fish and Game and cannot be released in California she was sent to the Big Bear Alpine Zoo. She is still a little shy and usually can be seen out in her exhibit in the morning and evening. Currently they are looking for a companion animal for her.

A LITTLE HISTORY OF THE ZOO

Since 1959 the Big Bear Alpine Zoo (formerly the Moonridge Animal Park) has been practicing the three R's, "Rescue, Rehabilitation and Release." Whenever possible, any injured or orphaned wild animal brought into the zoo is given a second chance to live free. When an animal is too compromised to exist without help they are given a home for life.

The zoo is also home to a threelegged black bear, Hucklebeary; a blind bald eagle, Valentine; two orphaned mountain lion sisters, Canyon and Cascade, and many other wonderful creatures whose lives depend on the dedicated care given by Curator Debbie Richardson and her staff.

Stagecoach Days events center around the wild west theme of "Phineas Rides Again." Phineas Banning operated a stagecoach line between San Pedro and Wilmington and later between Banning, California, which was named in his honor, and Yuma. Arizona.

A treat for the entire family is the Wild West Gunfighter and Historical Encampment Competition, located at the entrance to the park. Craftsmen will work on their trades and there will be various vendor booths selling era-themed items. The Border Renegades, a Banning group, hosts the lively gunfight show.

New this year is quad barrel racing which will be held on Friday at 7:30pm. The one-day rodeo was such a hit last year that the committee



William Royce Boz Scaggs began a long and storied career in 1965 with the release of his first solo recording, "Boz." Scaggs quickly developed into an iconic singer-songwriter, cutting his teeth playing with Steve Miller on several highly successful projects and honing his rock and R & B chops working with the likes of the Muscle Shoals Rhythm Section and Duane Allman.

Scaggs hit it big in 1976, achieving multi-platinum success

with Silk Degrees and its follow ups. Silk Degrees features hits like the Grammy Award winning "Lowdown" in addition to "Lido Shuffle," "What Can I Say" and the ballad "We're All Alone."

Scaggs then continued on a lauded and multi-genre musical journey with successes in film soundtracks including the song from the motion picture *Urban Cowboy*, "Look What You've Done To Me."

In his new album, *Memphis*, which came out in March 2013 on 429 Records, the Grammy-Award winning rock legend Boz Scaggs showcases both original songs and

The Wildly Successful Stand-Up Comedienne Anjelah Johnson

njelah Johnson, comedienne and actress, was born and raised in San Jose, California and is of Mexican and Native American descent. She got her start as a Pop Warner cheerleader and continued cheering through high school, college and then professionally for the Oakland Raiders. As an Oakland Raiderette, she was named "Rookie of the Year" and performed in Super Bowl XXXVII.

Anjelah became an internet sensation in 2007 with her viral video "Nail Salon," which led to many stand-up and performance opportunities. That same year she joined the cast of "MADtv" as a series regular, which spawned another internet sensation "Bon Qui Qui." This original char-

acter – a disgruntled fast food employee with no filter – became so popular that Anjelah recorded and released a full length rap song and music video as Bon Qui Qui. The song and the video are available on iTunes.

You've seen Anjelah in multiple ads and commercials including campaigns for Sprint, Visa, Snickers, Verizon, All-State, Washington Mutual, K-Swiss and Dreyer's Ice Cream. Additionally, she is the spokesperson for the Texas-based restaurant chain Taco Cabana. Anjelah has also guest starred on *The Shield, Ugly Betty, Curb Your Enthusiasm* and *Love Inc.* In 2007, she co-starred with Gabrielle Union in the feature film *The Box.* In 2008, Johnson was nominated for



an ALMA Award for Outstanding Female Performance in a Comedy Television Series for her work on MADtv.

In 2010, Anjelah starred in *Our Family Wedding* alongside Carlos Mencia, Regina King and Oscar winner Forest Whitaker. She played the feisty sister of America Ferrera in this comedy highlighting the perils and joys of combining families. Johnson also appeared as a live action character in 2009's *Alvin and the Chipmunks: The Squeakuel* alongside Jason Lee and the voices of Justin Long, Anna Faris and Amy Poehler. Anjelah additionally leant her voice to the animated film *Marmaduke* along with Emma Stone, Owen Wilson and Jeremy Piven.

choice covers including "Rainy Night in Georgia," "Corinna Corinna," and "Mixed Up, Shook Up Girl." Produced by Steve Jordan (John Mayer), *Memphis* was recorded at Willie Mitchell legendary Royal Studio in Memphis, where the late Mitchell recorded Al Green and other hit music artists. Joining Scaggs on *Memphis* are Willie Weeks (bass), Ray Parker, Jr. (guitars), Spooner Oldham (keyboards), the Memphis Horns, Lester Snell (string arrangements) and Steve Jordan (drums).

He and his band continue to tour worldwide and Scaggs also performs alongside Donald Fagan and Michael McDonald in their band billed as The Dukes of September. Within that collaboration, throughout his career and especially evident in *Memphis*, Scaggs' unique voice and trademark sound make plain his abiding respect for a wide spectrum of American roots music.

INTIMATE APPAREL


WEEKENDS NOV. 15 THROUGH DEC. 1, 2013

an African-American seamstress, who sews intimate apparel with great skill and discretion while living in a boarding house in 1905 New York City. She has managed to save a goodly sum of money for the high-end beauty parlor she dreams of opening. Her hope of finding love, however, has been more elusive. When she begins a correspondence with a man working on the Panama Canal it seems this dream, too, may soon arrive. Intimate Apparel is a play with adult content and is appropriate for mature audiences only.

A SHOT IN THE DARK

JAN. 24 THROUGH FEB. 9, 2014

The next play to be presented at Riverside Community Players will be A Shot in the Dark, a comedy with a touch of whodunit. Josefa, a parlor maid in the home of one of France's most wealthy and distinguished families, was found unconscious and clutching a gun beside the body of her dead lover, the family chauffeur. Josefa is brought before the examining magistrate on a charge of murder.

Meanwhile powerful political forces push the magistrate to obtain a quick confession and sweep the whole affair under the rug. Upon questioning, however, the magistrate concludes Josefa is innocent. At the risk of his own position, the magistrate pursues other suspects to determine who fired that fatal shot in the dark.

AGATHA CHRISTIE'S SPIDER'S WEB MARCH 28 THROUGH APRIL 13, 2014

The mystery offering this season will be Agatha Christie's Spider's Web, a thriller with a bit of comedy thrown in. Adept at spinning tales of adventure for their bored diplomatic circle, Clarissa finds coping with live drama much more difficult when an actual murder takes place in her own drawing room.

Anxious to clear the matter up before her husband Henry arrives home with a VIP in tow, Clarissa hides the body and attempts to solve the murder only to wind up involved in some hair-raising experiences. But will everything manage to be back to normal by the time Henry gets home or will scandal ensue? And will Clarissa ever figure out who the killer is? This atypical Christie play blends her legendary mystery writing with a light comic tone also seen in her Miss Marple novels.

AROUND THE WORLD IN 80 DAYS MAY 16 TO JUNE 1, 2014

Adapted by Mark Brown, Jules Verne's classic Around the World in 80 Days will also be presented by RCP this season. Fearless adventurer Phileas Fogg has agreed to an outrageous wager that puts his fortune and his life at risk. It is 1872 and with his resourceful servant, Passepartout, Fogg sets out to circle the globe in an unheard-of 80 days. This task leaves Fogg with difficulties enough, but a Scotland Yard Detective named Fix is convinced that Fogg is the gentleman bandit who recently robbed an English bank and dogs Fogg's every step. As they traverse seven continents, encounter stampeding elephants and typhoons, danger, romance and surprises abound in this whirlwind of a story. A rollicking, light-hearted adventure, Around the World in 80 Days is performed by only six actors, most of them playing many different parts.
