

The 104th Southern California Fair



Mark your calendar for the return of this nine-day fair, starting September 30.

The 104th edition of the Southern California Fair is fast approaching and will take place from Saturday, September 30th, through Sunday, October 8th. The nine-day fair, which was formerly known as the "Farmer's Fair," moved from Hemet to its current location on the SoCal Fair and Event Center (formerly known as the Lake Perris Fairgrounds) 30 years ago in 1987.

Today the fair contains all the amenities of a modern-day fair. However, like few others, it still retains much of its original small-town appeal and heritage. Hidden amongst the bright lights and modern day vibrations, fair goers can still enjoy many events from days gone by including livestock exhibits and competitions, a petting zoo and pony rides, contests, midway games, magicians, pig racing, old west shootouts, hay bucking and a ranch rodeo.

In addition to the old school attractions, 2017 fair goers will enjoy a multitude of other events and allures including concerts, motorcycle jumpers, demolition derbies, monster trucks, carnival riders, pet adoptions, and much more. Of course, the grounds will be clustered with a wide variety of mouthwatering fair foods and beverages.

This 2017 fair will feature several special days. Among them will be "Media Day" on September 29th. "Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts in Uniform Day" on September 30th. Scouts in uniform that day will be admitted free. Tuesday, October 4th will be "Read to Ride Day." Students from kindergarten to sixth-grade will need to read four age appropriate books to receive free admission and four free carnival ride tickets. Wednesday, October 4th will be "Taste of the Fair Day" and all concessionaires will carry at least one yummy menu item for \$3. Friday, October 6th, will be "Senior Day." From Noon to 3pm, seniors 60 and older will be admitted for \$5 and will receive a coupon for a free soft serve ice cream.

Daily tickets for this year's fair are \$10 for adults, \$8 for seniors (60 and older), and \$5 for children 5-12. Children aged 4 and under and active military members in uniform will be admitted free every day. Active military with proper id but not in uniform will receive a \$2 discount.

Pre-sale tickets will be available from August 14th through September 29th. They will save adults and seniors \$2 per daily ticket and kids will save \$1 per ticket. Annual passes, the best deal at

the fair, are only \$18 for adults and seniors and \$12 for kids. To order advance tickets, call (951) 657-4221.

Fair hours for 2017 are 11am to 11pm on Saturday and Sunday. 4pm to 11pm Monday through Thursday, and noon to 11pm on Friday.

The freeway-close Southern California Fair is located a little more than an hour east of Los Angeles and an hour north of San Diego at 18700 Lake Perris Drive in Perris. Fair goers can get more details at the following links.

affordable way to play anyway with all-day passes just \$15, 10 rides for \$10, or single rides for \$2. Parents who don't play never have to pay, many choosing to sit on one of two spacious sundecks with a good book while the kids have a blast. Or, head to the recently expanded indoor base lodge to escape the sun where there's video games and family-priced snack bar that includes an old-fashioned Breyers ice cream counter.

Alpine Slide is famous for its Olympic-style bobsleds which are in season all year long. Snow is never needed since the sleds have teflon runners and ballbearing wheels, and the quartermile long tracks with banked turns and long straightaways are cement.

Riders control their own speed with the brake, and unlike any amusement park ride, each

trip down is a completely unique and interactive experience. Lean into each turn and go into a tuck through straightaways to experience what it's like to be an Olympic bobsledder, or use the brake to go slow and soak in views of the lake and mountains.

For a relaxing change of pace enjoy a round on the Putt 'N Around miniature golf course, laden with rolling greens, water hazards, even penalty-stroke "sand traps."

Then for more fast fun, ride the Putt 'N Around Go-Karts, each equipped with 5.5 horsepower Honda motors and an array of safety features including three-point harness restraints, hydraulic disk brakes, rack and pinion steering and padded steering wheels. The tire-lined track sports hair pin and high banked turns as riders circle under the pines at 7,000 foot elevation.





ARTS IN LAGUNA Pageant Of The Masters Ready To Embark On 'The Grand Tour'

n the 17th and 18th centuries, the desire to experience the world's great art firsthand inspired the European tradition of continental travel on the Grand Tour. Inspired to set out on pilgrimages by land and sea to the great cultural centers of Europe, and eventually the globe, those early travelers often risked life and limb to stand in the presence of masterpieces. It's that original dedication to expanding one's horizons by visiting the great art centers of Europe that fueled Pageant Director Diane Challis Davy's excitement and research as she fine-tunes plans for this summer's production, *The Grand Tour*.

"Perhaps because I do so much virtual traveling via Google," Challis Davy offered, "I have a fantasy about actual travel and sightseeing. I was curious about the tremendous difficulties travelers encountered in the 18th century, with horsedrawn coaches on unpaved roads and no railways, no hotels. Even restaurants hardly existed, and there were virtually no public museums."

On the traditional Grand Tour, art became a destination for privileged travelers in much the way the Pageant during its 84-year history has become a destination for theatregoers who want to experience art in a one-of-a-kind entertainment. "Much of the show will unfold like a journey," Challis Davy said.

There'll be no shortage of masterpieces in the 2017 Pageant, including works by Leonardo da Vinci, Tiepolo, Longhi, Watteau, Reynolds, and Romney. But, as in previous years, the production's theme will expand to include American artists like John Singer Sargent whose work was transformed by his travels.

With the coming of the 20th century, new modes of transportation made it possible for almost everyone to go on their own "tourists' grand tour," and the theatrical possibilities assure no shortage of Pageant-style fun and inventive showmanship. A side trip to Pompeii, a celebration of Carnival in Venice and the European tour of Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show offer abundant opportunities for surprises and special effects. A tribute to Paris in the early 20th century when audiences in clubs embraced the talents of Josephine Baker, Louis Armstrong, and Duke Ellington reveals how a change of scene can launch an artist's career.

Among the great stories associated with the original Grand Tours, Challis Davy has her own favorites including the romantic saga of




Lord Hamilton, Emma Hart, and Lord Nelson, whose exploits helped make Naples a must-see destination during the late 18th century.

Pageant Scriptwriter Dan Duling explained, "I hope we can recreate some of that sense of awe shared by those early travelers when they visited the grand palaces, ancient ruins and art centers of Europe. The original Grand Tours were educational pilgrimages, to Paris, Rome, and beyond. Those who made the journeys couldn't help but be changed by what they saw, what they brought back, and what they experienced so far from home."

As always, Challis Davy and her staff realize the Pageant wouldn't be possible without their


