emy instructor Alberto "Beto" Jimenez) will highlight their premiere performance with a symphony orchestra.


Former San Bernardino Mayor Judith Valles, a founding director of Sinfonia Mexicana, will serve as guest master of ceremonies.

he San Bernardino Symphony will open its 2010–2011 season, Maestro Carlo Ponti's tenth anniversary, with one of Beethoven's greatest works. This popular work by Beethoven was the first piece Maestro Ponti conducted with the orchestra when he began his tenure ten years ago.

Also included in the October 9 concert, performed at 8pm at the California Theatre in San Bernardino, are Beethoven's Leonore Overture no.1 and Antonin Dvorak's Violin Concerto in a minor, op.53. Acclaimed violinist Livia Sohn, whom *Opus Magazine* has called a "stunning musician," will perform the Dvorak Violin Concerto.

This funfilled, interactive family concert concludes with W.A. 





"The 5000 square foot Pueblo is made with found and reclaimed materials including telephone poles, windows, buck board wagon parts and other materials," Lorraine Becker, Cabot's Museum Foundation Board President, said. "His work and legacy make Cabot Yerxa a green architect before there was a designation."

The museum story also includes Yerxa's discovery of the international award-winning mineral springs and drinking water, perhaps the greatest natural resource to the residents of Desert Hot Springs. During his homesteading process from 1913-1918 he hand dug two wells: one hot mineral water,

the other cold spring water. The wells were only 600 yards apart. This inspired him to name his homestead "Miracle Hill."

At the time of his death in 1965, Cabot Yerxa was called, "The Guiding Light of Desert Hot Springs." Among his many civic roles, he laid the cornerstone on the city fire station, established the city library and founded the Desert Hot Springs Improvement Association.

Cabot's Pueblo Museum is a registered historical site designated by the County of Riverside and a non-profit 501c3 managed in partnership with the City of Desert Hot Springs. The museum hosts thousands of visitors who delight in the history and connection to the past, making it one of the most popular attractions in Desert Hot Springs.

Actor Clint Howard to be honored at the Big Bear Lake International Film Festival




he Big Bear Lake International Film Festival (BBLIFF) announced Clint Howard as the 2010 recipient of the Acting Award of Excellence.
